#### Free disposal weekend for recyclables in September

Goulburn Mulwaree Council's free e-waste disposal weekend will occur on Saturday 19th and Sunday 20th September after being postponed earlier this year due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Council will accept fridges/freezers/air-conditioners, mattresses, clean steel and e-waste across this weekend at Waste Management Centres in Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago. Bulky household general waste such as furniture or garden waste will be accepted at the November disposal weekend later this year.

Mayor Bob Kirk encouraged residents to plan ahead to take advantage of the September weekend.

"This weekend is always a busy, successful one, and a great opportunity to clean out the shed or the spare room. E-waste accepted includes televisions, computers, printers, fax machines and computer accessories, while mattresses are always a popular item to dispose of."

"Council is proud to offer this weekend as a service to residents of the region. There may be some line-ups across the weekend so please be patient, but we will have extra staff working to get everyone in and out as quickly as possible, while following COVID-safe protocols."

Each household is entitled to dispose of two fridges/freezers, two mattresses, one airconditioner, 1m cubed of e-waste and /or up to 2m cubed of clean steel items free of charge. Any other waste will be charged as per normal fees and charges.

The weekend is a self-haul to waste centre event, and those seeking assistance to get items to the tip are encouraged to contact local waste disposal companies and handyman services.

Due to the impacts of COVID-19 and social distancing requirements, Council staff will not be able to assist customers in unloading their items as has occurred in previous years. Residents must ensure they are able to unload vehicles themselves, for example by ensuring more than one person attends for unloading. If it took two people to load an item, please ensure two people are on-hand to unload.

All Waste Management Centres are open from 7am to 4pm on Saturday and Sunday.



It is sometimes very satisfactory when plans come to fruition. This has happened with the news that Marulan Cricket Club is to be resurrected. This is something the community wanted, and it is part of the Village Strategic Plan. The Chamber of Commerce is part of the Village Committee, and recently voted to spend monies on replacement of the cricket pitch which will happen in the next month or two.

The expenditure on the revamping of the tennis court makes the area a very modern sporting precinct and a valuable asset to the Village's present and future residents. The new tennis court, court lighting and cricket to be played on the field, will enable the Village to go and see, and participate in sport on first class grounds. It will also mean teams from Goulburn and Southern Highlands will visit Marulan.

We are sure with the enthusiasm of the new Cricket Committee that many exciting things will happen.

#### **OUR 15th ANNIVERSARY**

In farewelling Lorna Parr we were reminded that it was 15 years since some eager people met at Lorna's home in Stoney Creek Road to form a Society. Later when she bought "Wattle Glen" Tea Rooms members met there regularly and planned many activities. One of these was for the Marulan School's "Hands On" History Lesson.

We soon realised the necessity for having proper storage for all the artefacts and resources which had been donated to us. Talks were held with GMC who offered the Society some of the HASP land. Aglime, who was locating elsewhere, donated its office building and arrangements were made to put the building on Council land at the rear of the Brewer Centre.

It was put on foundations but was obviously not secure as it blew down. It was then found to have asbestos and had to be removed.

Things were getting desperate so we began discussions with the Uniting Church to utilise the land at the rear of the church. With the generous donations from many local businesses and residents, MARC (Marulan Archives and Resource Centre) was opened on 29th May, 2016.

The interest in the Society kept growing and it soon became apparent that our one building was not able to cope with all the artefacts, books, records photos etc. We then set about extending our premises which is now almost complete.

A long time resident and committed community member of Marulan, Mary Dukes, passed away earlier this month after a short illness.

Mary and Bill Dukes settled in Marulan in the 1960s and took over the corner store formerly operated by Coopers and prior to that, Grierlys. Dukes' corner store was one of three operating in Marulan at the time and many local girls worked there over the years.

Bill took the mail run to Bungonia but after the 1965 fire when the Tallong mailman's house was burnt down, he took over the Tallong mail run, continuing it until he retired. The store closed in 1989 and became Mary and Bills' private residence. Their four daughters, Sandra, Kerry, Marie and Mandy grew up in Marulan, attending Marulan Public School and going to High School in Goulburn before moving away to various cities Australia-wide, giving Mary plenty of opportunities for travel.

Noeleen Sieler was a near neighbour and close friend of Mary.

"My friendship with Mary has been over 50 years, our daughters were born days apart.

Mary loved her garden and maintained it herself up until the end of last year. She loved Marulan and knew everybody here and worked tirelessly for most organisations for many years.

Mary's friends and I will miss her greatly, she was a loyal friend to me"

#### Marie Pender's thoughts of Mary -

"In the late 1960s Mary and I would play tennis at Marulan South in the evening with all the locals out there. Then in the 70s we went for 2 years to TAFE in Goulburn and attended cooking classes. At the end of each term we invited friends and relatives and they shared our concoctions. Mary and I added far too much Szechuan pepper in our dish and we almost killed everyone. In 1979 we shared a tent with Shirley Feltham and went camping to the Red Centre. Alison Sieler and her two sisters also came on that coach trip which lasted for 16 days. Lots of wonderful memories and some very funny times.

We attended local balls and hockey games and the Sydney Easter Show. Bering a hairdresser, I did her hair for 50 years. She was a wonderful friend"

Both Mary and Bill were involved in many town activities and clubs, including the School P & C, the Hall Committee, Pony Club, Hockey Club, and Progress Association, to name just a few. Mary was made a life member of Marulan School P & C and was named Australia Day Citizen of the Year in 1999. She was always treasurer of the many organisations she was involved in and also audited the books for most of the town clubs and societies. She was very involved with the 150th Marulan celebrations, every Australia Day celebration for many years, and Marulan Heritage Days.

#### VALE ALETA CURRY.

It was with great shock and sadness that Tallong residents learned of the death of Aleta Curry in Goulburn Hospital, on Wednesday morning 26 August 2020.

Aleta was the third President of the Tallong Community Focus Group after serving as Vice President while David Leese was in charge. She became President in October 2008, remaining in that position for 2 years. The committee she led was responsible for overseeing the development of a more pro-active stance with regard to Goulburn Mulwaree Council than during preceding years, which has been built on subsequently. The TCFG was heavily involved in the development of the Tallong Village Plan of 2010, organising community involvement through a questionnaire and workshop meetings.

During this time also, the village regained control of the old picnic ground and playing field on Barbers Creek Rd. and by the middle of 2009 the Tallong Picnic and Recreation Reserve Trust had been gazetted. Aleta was a member of the Reserve Trust until 2019. The Paint the Pot project was completed in 2009 and the completed work was officially opened on Apple Day, 2009. As President of the TCFG, Aleta was also head of the organising committee for Apple Day for two years as well as being an ex-officio (non-voting) member of the Tallong Memorial Hall Trust.

With her history degree and interest in oral history, Aleta was involved in the writing of the book "Tallong: a Heritage". She covered the twentieth century history of the village as well as formatting the final document.



Aleta was a forceful and dynamic woman who carried herself with grace and dignity. She had definite opinions but believed strongly that, as she wrote in her President's Report of 2010: "Cooperation needs to remain a watchword; when community groups become more concerned about individual areas of control rather than the district as a whole, people may be able to satisfy their egos with a sense of power and control in the short term, but eventually the region will decay due to a lack of real commitment and support." She also had a wicked sense of humour and will be greatly missed by everyone who came in contact with her.
