Shear n Dipity

**Think Globally
Act Locally**



With a successful hairdressing salon in Bargo, Connie Dunn, a business owner with over 25 years of experience, saw the potential in Marulan and decided to take a leap of faith and open a hairdressing salon at the Marulan Village Centre just over 12 months ago. She did not envisage the overwhelming support from the community and local businesses that she has experienced. Through this support, she is now expanding her salon and has recently employed 2 new staff members to keep up with the demand.

Shear n Dipity is a classy modern salon. Besides walking out with a fabulous fresh new look, the experience's highlight is definitely the always bubbly, smiling, friendly and outgoing personalities—Connie, the owner, Sam the Senior Stylist and Indy the Emerging Stylist. Attentive to your needs, the ladies of Shear n Dipity are delightful, and the service is wonderful.

Connie has always been conscious of the environment, and it never felt right seeing how many products went to waste, so she decided to do something about it. So what is Shear n Dipity doing about it?

All 95% of waste that used to go to landfill now gets reused and recycled. The salon has different allocation bins for products, they empty and wash out old shampoo bottles that were previously unable to be recycled, and they now get recycled into road base!

Metals in tubes (including Indy’s chilli tuna tin!), foils, plastics, shampoo bottles, water bottles, coffee cup lids and paper all get recycled. The team has now turned the waste around to being only 5% waste and 95% recycled materials, which is an outstanding achievement.

Only 5% of the dirty footprint, which includes gloves and food scraps. Do not think that’s the end of it, as the salon is awaiting their first shipment of biodegradable gloves! “We have a responsibility to look after our planet. At the beginning of COVID, we all saw the results of the pollution rates dropping and clean our waterways, rivers, and our planet became as there was less of a footprint. It opened our eye to how bad the situation really was, and we all need to find a way to counteract. This was our way.” Connie proudly states.

What does it mean to be a sustainable salon, and how are the salons supported?

- Sustainable Salons provides all in-salon separation bins and outside collection bins to suit the salon’s needs and offers a fortnightly collection service directly to the salon door.
- Plastic packaging is sent to specialist local plastics recyclers. It’s cleaned and made into outdoor furniture, landscape supplies and new product packaging, keeping it in circulation and out of our oceans!
- All aluminium, foil, colour tubes, cardboard, paper, magazines, razor blades, unwanted tools and select disposables are sold for recycling. The proceeds are donated to Oz Harvest and Kiwi Harvest to provide meals for hungry people. A full head of foils provides a quarter of a meal to someone in need!
- Hair clippings are collected from the salon floor and stuffed into stockings to make Hair Booms that can one day help clean up oil spills along our coastlines! Hair is also repurposed in local community gardens for composting or used in sustainable art installations to educate the community.
- All collected ponytails 20cm or longer are distributed to charitable organisations to create wigs for those suffering from cancer or alopecia. Sustainable Salons is the largest donor of ponytails in the Southern Hemisphere!
- By collecting small amounts from a large salon network, Sustainable Salons is the first company to recycle excess chemicals in the salon industry. These are pooled and sent to chemical recycling plants where they’re neutralised and turned into recycled water used in roadworks and construction.

Pheasant Wood Circuit

On a Sunday in March, I had the chance to visit Pheasant Wood Circuit, and I must say I was incredibly impressed. It is such a unique facility, and is growing their user base consistently!

Based on Prairie Oak Road, it's in a great location that is easy to access, while also being out of the way. They offer learn to drive programs, endurance racing, open track days and corporate events. Their circuit is currently 1.5kms long, but they have plans to extend it significantly to up to 7 kilometres eventually.

With Wakefield Park and Pheasant Wood Circuit, both operating successfully and attracting people from around the country Goulburn Mulwaree is fast becoming the home of motorsport in NSW.



Local Roads & Community Infrastructure Grants

During March our teams were out in Marulan undertaking footpath work, as part of the Federal Government funding we received through the Local Roads & Community Infrastructure Grants. These funds were designed to stimulate the economy following COVID-19 and needed to be spent within this financial year.

Councillors wanted to ensure that some of this money was spent in our rural communities, and chose new footpaths as great projects which we were able to undertake quickly. In Marulan we allocated \$120,000 of the funding received in the first allocation on footpaths on George Street (Brayton Rd Intersection), Maclura Drive (Morris Pl to Stoney Creek Rd) and Stoney Creek Road (Brayton Rd to end), which are now nearing completion as I write this column.

We have also chosen to continue these footpath projects in villages with some of the funding received in Round two and will be consulting with Village Discretionary Funding allocation groups to determine the priority list for this work.

Council's compost product launched

Compost created right here in Goulburn from residents' recycled organic waste was launched for sale in March, at the Goulburn Waste Management Centre.

The project has been a long journey, beginning with the rollout of green bins, and then the construction of an organic waste pad, and the continual effort where staff have refined our processes to end up with the compost we have now. A few weeks ago I joined Member for Goulburn Wendy Tuckerman to learn more about the process. It has been a long journey for Council, and staff put countless hours into our processes to create a saleable product.

Due to the successful rollout of green bins, and the response of our community, Council has now commenced procurement for a machine to screen compost.

\$392,063 was received through the NSW Government Waste Less Recycle More Program for Organic Recycling Infrastructure Upgrades, with this amount being matched by Council. \$549,630 was also received through this program in 2018 for the rollout of green organic waste bins. These grants are provided through the NSW EPA and are funded through the waste levy. We are still working through the opening hours where the product is for sale, but early pricing is \$20 a trailer load, or \$90 per tonne.

Recently I have been approached on what the Village Committee does and what it has achieved. This committee has addressed and completed the following:


1. Resurrection of Cricket Ground
2. Resurfacing and lighting of Tennis Court
3. Installation of planter boxes in George Street
4. Tree planting in Goulburn Street, Brayton Road, Portland Avenue, and at the side of BP North
5. Seating in Rotunda
6. Irrigation of Soccer Field
7. Monies for Amenities Shed on Soccer Field
8. Fencing of Meridian Park
9. Fencing on the Soccer field to prevent balls from going into neighbours' gardens.

We are currently working on footpaths in Marulan, and these will be completed within the next three months.

The Village Committee is working its way through the Village Strategic Plan, established after two consultation nights with Council's Consultant and endorsed by Council.

This plan includes large items, which are the responsibility of the Council. The largest being the upgrading of the water treatment plant and the sewerage treatment plant for Marulan. These are long-term plans and are being addressed by the Council inside their budgetary constraints and seek government grants to complete these objectives.
