TO DO IN JANUARY 2020

As it looks like the **HOT & DRY SUMMER** will continue with little rain in sight ...

MAKE SURE

Birds & bees have water in dry spells

KEEP new & young plants watered if possible

BE on the alert for pests

SUMMER PRUNE wisteria - it looks much better the following Spring after a good summer trim

WATER vegetables regularly if you have a vegetable garden this year.

CLEAN out gutters & **REMOVE** debris around the garden to minimise the bush-fire risk

WHIPPER SNIP around the garden to tidy up any dead grass along the boundaries.

ORDER spring flowering bulks if you just can't resist them!

USE SHADE CLOTH to protect sun-sensitive plants

WATER with a **DRIP** system which is more economical & water wise than small risers with sprays

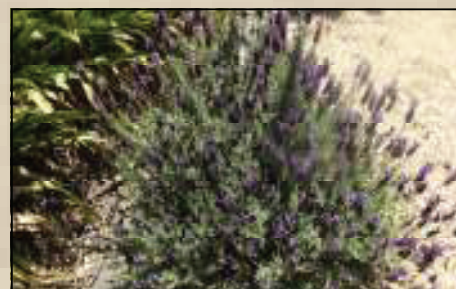
SUMMER 2020

In a new, special quarterly feature the **Discover Marulan Newsletter** is featuring the gardens of our local residents in & around our region.

The garden below was established back in 1992, and is located on Tickner Valley Road in Marulan. Like all of the gardens in our region it is suffering very badly with the prolonged drought conditions. The garden has been beautifully laid out with gravel paths & rock edges separating all the beds with different plantings among which bulbs are a major feature - spring flowering bulbs and many, many iris, although this year flowering has been limited by the weather. The garden, due to its age, and the knowledge of it's owners who are keen gardeners, will no doubt survive the extremely dry weather, but with little hope of rain on the horizon, hand watering small areas is the only option with water at a premium. But, the chooks are happy, laying non-stop, beautiful, big brown eggs!



Whilst the ongoing drought is badly affecting so many gardens in Marulan, some of the plants that seem to thrive are roses & lavender.



AN OASIS IN THE HEART OF MARULAN

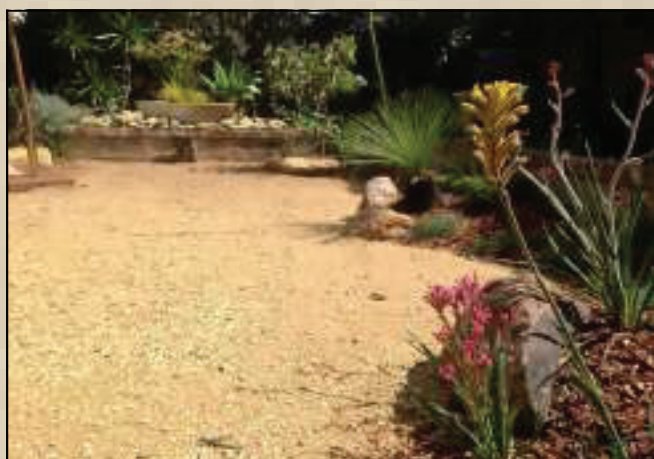
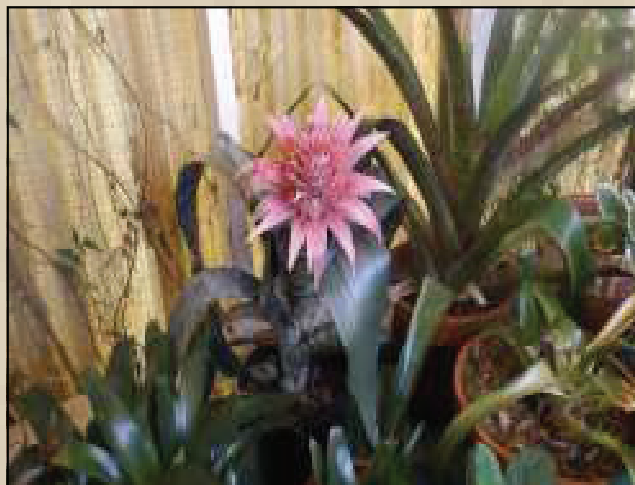
The garden featured on the right is a very old garden & is in the heart of Marulan.

The garden is very sheltered and features fern houses, fruit trees, dozens of roses & many potted plants.

Some of the fern houses have spectacular bromeliads such as the pink one on the right.

Although we, like the rest of Australia are suffering from the drought, the garden continues to manage quite well mainly because it is old & established.

The front is a picture of lavender & roses & a wonderful smoke bush. Along one boundary, & right up into the old apple tree, which does bear fruit every year, is a very old wisteria which is a delight each Spring.



A GARDEN FOR A DRIER CLIMATE

Newer gardens are being planned around plants which require a great deal less water than some in the established gardens in Marulan and there are any number of drought resistant plants to choose from.

Crushed limestone looks good on a driveway & in amongst plants, is easy maintenance & best of all keeps the weeds down in laid down fairly thickly.

A drive around Marulan will give you ideas of what other residents are doing with gardens - quite a lot of pots with flax and grasses, pebbles instead of grass (much easier on the water!).

The little garden outside Marulan Butchery is managing to survive with lots of smaller flowers and it faces west which means it has a lot of wind to cope with too.

Amber Level Water Restrictions are now in effect



All areas of Goulburn and Marulan with reticulated water are now on amber level water restrictions. Target consumption is 230 litres per person per day.

Under amber level restrictions, use of Goulburn and Marulan water supply is restricted to:

- Hand held hose with a control nozzle or bucket can only be used between 5pm and 10am to water plants and lawns
- Watering systems and hose sprinklers can only be used between 5pm and 10am on weekends
- Paths, driveways and hard surfaces cannot be cleaned. In extraordinary circumstances for example following a health threatening incident, a hose can be used to assist to clean up
- Vehicles can be washed at any time on a lawn or porous surface using a hose with a control nozzle, bucket or low volume high pressure machine
- Private pools can only be filled when a water offset plan for that residence has been met, including the mandatory use of a pool cover when the pool is not in use. For further details see [Council's Water Use Policy](#)

METHOD:

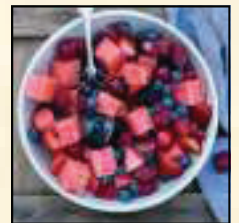
Layer, tomato, cheese & basil on a serving platter and drizzle with dressing

4 sheets Shortcrust pastry
4c left over Bolognese sauce
1/2c grated Parmesan cheese
1 egg, lightly beaten

METHOD:

Heat oven to 180degC. Cut 16 11.5cm rounds from pastry. Spoon 1/4c sauce into the centre of each round, sprinkle with cheese. Brush edges with a little egg, fold rounds in half to enclose filling, pinch edges to seal.

Place on trays & brush with egg. Bake about 15 mins. until nicely browned.

Cut pastry stack in half. Place 1 stack on top of the other. Cut crossways into 24 strips. Twist each strip. Place on trays & bake about 12 mins. or until golden brown.
