

A message from the Mayor

Marulan Reserves

Council has allocated \$50,000 for the upgrade of Marulan Reserves and sports fields over the next six months. We are planning the upgrade of the electricity supply at the sporting fields, but we are also interested in getting your feedback on what you believe is a priority for recreational space at Marulan. Please contact Rob Hughes at Council with your ideas by calling 4823 4444.

Upgrades at Marulan Waste Centre

We've recently built a new amenities building at the Marulan Waste Centre to give staff access to a kitchen, proper bathroom and working area. To bring power up the road to the building was estimated to cost \$100,000; Council investigated other solutions and settled on a fantastic solar power system, at a much lower cost of \$50,000.

The system uses cutting edge Lithium Ion batteries to store the power, and also includes an inverter and a generator for emergency backup supply. The solar panels have the capacity to generate 21Kw/H daily, and this will easily power the building – including air conditioning, computer systems and amenities. A security system has also been installed as part of the upgrade.

Hours at the facility have been changed to 8am-12pm Monday & Friday, and 8am-4pm Saturday and Sunday. The centre will be closed on public holidays, and closed between 12 noon and 12:30pm on opening days to allow the operator a lunch break.

The Goulburn Art Award 2016

The much-anticipated biennial Gallery event will open on Thursday the 7th of July with the announcement of winners at 6pm. This year we will have Susi Muddiman OAM, the Director of Tweed Regional Gallery & the Margaret Olley Art Centre as the judge.

The open prize is an exhibition at the Gallery in 2017, with \$400 towards the exhibition costs; all prizes are sponsored by Topshot Photographics and Prints. The works entered in the awards will then be on display until the 23rd of July – make sure you take the time to head down and have a look!

Gunlake Quarry proposal community consultation meeting

The Department of Planning and Environment held a public meeting at the Marulan Community Hall on Thursday 30th June. It provided the community a chance to share their views and feedback – I hope many of you reading this were able to attend.

Wollondilly River Walkway

Construction of stage one of the Wollondilly River walkway is nearing completion, with many community members already taking advantage of the area to exercise, take a stroll with the family or walk their dogs.

The walkway is one of a number of key projects currently underway in the Goulburn Mulwaree region, and is aimed at promoting a healthy lifestyle, as well as unlocking the fantastic natural resource that is the Wollondilly River.

Work on stage one of the project began in March, beginning at Marsden Weir, just off Fitzroy Street. This section of the walkway will follow the river, linking with adjoining streets such as Albert, Prince and Gibson Streets, before reaching the Victoria Street Bridge. Also included in the first stage is a footbridge that will link with the other side of the river, meeting Leggett Park.

I went down for a look at the progress just last week, and was really impressed. It's also great to see the result of blackberry clearing and landscaping – it's really opened up the river to the community.

Marulan Progress Association News



At this time the main focus of the Progress Association is the completion of the Meridian Arch. It was built with the help of a Centenary of Federation grant in 2001, with the Association providing more than \$9,000 towards its erection.

Tallong Sculptor Sebastian Meijbaum's design won but it was always his dream to complete a mosaic of the world on the floor of the arch. Sadly Sebastian passed away before it could be completed.

Now with the help of \$2,000 from Holcim and with a donation from Sebastian's family as well as all of the Associations savings we hope to have the \$12,600 needed to complete the mosaic by the end of this year.

Another project we have been working with Goulburn Mulwaree Council is to have a bus shelter installed at Marulan Railway Station. Many people including the elderly and young parents with toddlers use the railway bus each day to go shopping in Goulburn.

As there is no place for customers to sit or have shelter whilst waiting outside the station. The Progress Association received many requests to do something about it and now GMC has advised that it will provide the seat shortly.

Marulan & District Progress Association is first mentioned as working for the community in 1880 when members of the community requested a meeting with residents asking for improvements to Marulan Public School.

Lorna Parr has written a history of the Association from 1880 to 2015 and she says that it can sometimes be frustrating as proposals are made and letters are written but there often are not any replies to the requests recorded.

The membership seems to fluctuate according to the pressing needs of the community at certain times. Some of the most memorable of these being:

- The fight to obtain a doctor for Marulan after the 2nd World War.
- When in 1980 DMR were proposing to bypass Marulan and had only allowed one entry (this meant that all traffic from the south would have had to travel to Tallong turnoff, do a "U" turn and come back over the bridge). Membership rose to over 50 members. We even had a "fighting" fund and employed a barrister.
- Other were the Tony Onions Park, water supply for Marulan electricity, obtaining Housing Commission homes, Meridian Park, closing of railway crossing and the closing of the Southern entrance across the Highway.

Now the Association works with the community for better roads, footpaths and improvements in parks, etc. We also run "Light up Marulan" at Christmas time.



Marulan Lions Club

In one of the largest single philanthropic gifts for children's cancer in Australia, Lions Clubs International (LCIF) and the Australian Lions Childhood Cancer Research Foundation (ALCCR) will contribute \$3.2 million - with an ALCCRF commitment to raise an additional \$0.8 million over the next three years.

Our mammoth donation will allow hundreds of Aussie kids with cancer to access new genome sequencing technologies pioneered by the "Garvin Institute of Medical Research" that could guide their treatment and save lives.

The Lions Kids genome project, an important new component of the "Zero Childhood Cancer" program for diagnosis and treatment of Childhood cancer was announced at the Lions Convention in Echuca last month. Cancer is the most common cause of disease related deaths in Australian Children Every year more than 950 children and adolescents are diagnosed with cancer and nearly three die each week. This project is a collaborative partnership between the 'Zero Childhood cancer Program, led by the Children's Cancer Institute and the Kids Cancer Centre in the Sydney Children's hospital, Randwick and the Garvin Institute of Medical research.

This is one of many projects the Lions Club of Marulan & District is involved with and of course we are always on the lookout for prospective members to assist with our projects. Who are we? We are a group of local residents trying to improve the appearance of our town.

Why do we do this? If our town looks appealing and cared for, this will attract visitors who will support our local businesses. It also makes it a better environment for us to live in as locals.

The Garden Guru

It is the middle of winter and with it comes the rain and frosty mornings. Now is the time to take cuttings of Fuchias. They grow easily from cuttings. You can cut off a tip of a branch and put in water to root or cut down further just into the woody part, dip the end in honey or rooting compound and place in potting mix. Put the pot in a sheltered, frost free area. My Fuchias have been hit by the frosts but I leave the frosted branches to be trimmed in the spring to grow new strong branches.

Late July or early August is rose pruning time. Clip them back by two thirds to just above a leaf, fertilise and spray. Cut out any dead or damaged wood. Dig up and transplant any roses that are in the wrong place in your garden.

Winter is also a great time to revamp and clean up your garden. Get rid of any trees and bushes that are dead or dying. Paint your fences or refresh paving or decking. Pot up some spring or summer flowering annuals.

Sometimes July weather is great for armchair gardening. It is time to sit down and look at catalogues and gardening books for new ideas and for spring planting.

The Creative Cook

Is there anything better than the waft of freshly made pancakes for brekkie? Or for that matter, brunch, lunch, dinner and dessert? Here's a tried and tested menu that'll make it easy to drag your family from the telly.

Ingredients

2 eggs

2 tbs sugar

Vanilla essence/extract

1 cup yoghurt (any kind)

2 tsp baking powder

4 tbs melted and cooled butter

1 cup plain flour

1 cup chopped strawberries or bananas

Whipped cream for serving

Method

Stir the baking powder into the yoghurt, then pour into bowl. Add eggs, sugar, vanilla and melted butter. Mix the ingredients (just to combine them, don't overmix). Add the flour (just to combine). Finally, stir in the strawberries (or whatever fruit you've decided to use.

Heat a non-stick frying pan. Brush with some butter if needed. Pour part of the batter (it's very thick, you'll need to spoon it and spread it). Cover over medium heat until you see bubbles on the surface. Flip the pancake and cook for another minute or so until browned. Serve with whipcream or yoghurt drizzled with honey.

The Hon Angus Taylor MP and Mayor of Goulburn Mulwaree Geoff Kettle today officially opened the new Kippilaw Bridge, Goulburn. Kippilaw Bridge is the first of a number of projects funded under the Federal Government Bridges Renewal Program to be undertaken in the coming years – including Lansdowne Bridge and Komungla Bridge in Goulburn Mulwaree.

April May and June have been busy for HASP volunteers.

A small dedicated group came together to prepare and man a stall for Tallong Apple Day so we could share the vision and activities available on the Regional Heritage Trial.

An Expression of Interest for grant funding was prepared and submitted to Restart NSW Resources for Regions Program. We are hopeful that we might get to the second stage and be able to provide detailed information on the construction and outline of the parklands in Marulan.

Congratulations goes to Ben Gordon, the graduate who designed the parkland concept. Ben is currently in the US and has been offered full time employment as a Landscape Architect. It means a loss for us as Ben wont be able to actively assist in the park development in the future but we wish him well.

A presentation has also been made to Council as to the landscape plan for the parklands with a request that Council consider a representative being on the executive committee of HASP once we push ahead with construction. Council have supported this and we welcome Councillor Banfield to the Committee.

As the project continues to take shape and we develop the idea of the Heritage heartlands and regional heritage trail we are investgating the need to incorporate and form an independent not for profit organisation. We will be seeking volunteers over the next couple of months who are willing to become the executive of HASP.

In line with this is the review and design of a new logo.

The logo aims to represent

European and Indigenous Heritage, the Natural environment of this area and Agricultural and Mining Heritage. We hope to bring these aspects together in the Regional heritage trail for people to visit and enjoy in the villages north of Goulburn.

Fundraising is always important to ventures such as HASP and we thank Rosemary Turner for offering to host sheep on our behalf. Sheep are funded by members and Rosemary manages the ewes and lambs. Wool and / or the sheep are sold with HASP retaining the profit after any costs that Rosemary needs to recover. If you

Boral's Marulan South Operations are pleased to present our regular newsletter for the information of our valued neighbours and wider community.

Toys in quarrying

Have you ever thought about the use of toys in quarrying? Who would have ever thought of using a modified remote control car to do inspections?

One of the Boral quarries north of Sydney are doing exactly that and we are trying it at Peppertree. Using the car, means we limit the need for staff to enter confined spaces to inspect the inside of screens to see how well they are operating. Now the argument is who gets to drive!



With new technology we are also in the process of using drones. After some flying lessons, we utilise the drones to get a high level view of the pit operations, stockpiles and survey data without having to wait for more formal monthly reviews.



Forecasting operations

Forecasting the weather doesn't just let us plan our weekends but also our pit operations at Marulan south. Both sites use a specific forecast tailored to identify when there might be high winds and heavy rainfall.

The forecast provides trigger levels and supporting procedures are in place to make sure the operations can manage the wind and heavy rain. For example in the last east Coast low, pumps were put in place 48 hours before rain was expected to fall and arrangements made with staff and contractors to be available. This meant that the sites were ready for the rain and no severe flooding was experienced. Our next step is to have messages sent to phones to alert us when things are going to happen.

Peppertree Phase 2

The end of June sees the completion of the removal of overburden on the current working area of the pit at Peppertree.

This is the material that sits above the rock and has to be removed and stored before quarrying can occur. The completion of this work sees the pit move into phase 2 going another 15 metres deeper to a new level and the extensions and relocation of the in pit conveyors.

Project Success

The Boral Concrete NSW team has successfully secured the supply contract for 500,000 cubic metres of concrete to the NorthConnex motorway in western Sydney.

The project comprises nine kilometres of tunnels and will ease Sydney's traffic congestion, bypassing 21 sets of traffic lights. It is expected to be completed in mid-2019, and aggregates for the concrete will be provided by Peppertree.

CVA

Conservation Volunteers Australia in conjunction with Boral has recently undertaken work in the southern highlands.

As part of the Connected Communities program, planning is underway to assist in rehabilitation works in Tallong in association with the Memorial park, and if possible with the involvement of the school.

We have learnt our lesson. The challenge of a touch screen to order your own hamburger from the Golden Arches had traumatised us.

Give us a waiter with a pen and paper whom after we have viewed a menu writes down our request and takes it to the kitchen. Better still I like menus with numbers, little chance of a mix up. The responsibility resting firmly on my shoulders when I state I want number 5 with a side of number 9. The chances of me getting what I wanted expedentially increase without human interference or interpretation. I have cleary stated 5 and 9 and would expect to be delivered exactly that. Unless of course the waiter or the cook is not numeric, then we may have a problem.

But there is another bothering trend, which is being spread amongst restaurants and cafes. The use of terms which are made whether intentionally or not confusing. Terms such as deconstructed, which if it's a deconstructed hamburger means the ingredients of a burger are spread across the plate ie deconstructed. So if you want a burger, it's up to you to reconstruct the ingredients into something that looks like the burger you originally wante. But this conspiracy to confuse the diner is a wider problem than flowers in your salad. The problem is interpreting what you are ordering.

Roux, ganache, crumbled pancetta, celery froth, infused everything, quinoa salad, buckwheat bread, jobo berry chutney, and the list goes on, that's before you reach the burger meat. It could be saltbush lamb, organic beef, Wagu beef massaged every two weeks to tenderize the meat. Then there's dry hung, aged, grass fed, grain fed, marbled, home butchered organic, all this to describe the meat pattie on your hamburger.

We were so traumatised from our last outing we have not ventured out and not been in the mood to wade through all the terms. Not wanting to disappoint our many many readers, this week we made our own burgers at home. This entails exposing a recipe that has been in our family for generations, a bit like the finger licking good herbs and spices recipe. Passed down, never to be revealed of course, I have never been one to be able to keep a secret so here we go.......

From my local butcher 500 grams of beef mince, one sausage, one brown onion and one egg. Dice onions, skin sausage, place in bowl with mince and crack the egg into the meat mix. With hands very sensual and therapeutically form the meat mixture into patties of desired size. In a pan on moderate heat, add olive oil and slip in your patties to fry.

While the patties are cooking prepare the buns to your tasting. Some like beetroot, some like pickles, some mustard. Mine was traditional; lettuce, tomatoe, beetroot and then you slip on the golden brown pattie smothered in BBQ sauce. It would be unfair to mark my own burger but let me say it was heaven. Juices ran down my chin as I munched into it.

Maybe next time we will venture out to another unsuspecting town and try our luck.






