Maintenance Works

Throughout August and early September our Community Facilities Team spent a significant amount of time in Marulan undertaking maintenance works and some minor CBD enhancements.

Projects included painting of the guard rail and extension of the fence along the frontage of Tony Onions Park, plantings around the newly constructed toilets and installation of pots on the corner of George Street and Goulburn Street.

Other work planned later in the year includes installation of concrete kerbs around the trees on the southern entrance to Marulan.

Community Outreach Meeting

Our community outreach meeting schedule for 2019 has been finalised, and will be widely publicised over the coming months.

These meetings are a great opportunity for our rural villages to speak directly to Councillors and Senior Staff regarding issues of importance to you, but it's also important to note that Councillors can be contacted at any time, and service requests can be generated during a quick phone call to staff on 4823 4444.

This year we will be visiting Marulan on Thursday the 17th October at 6:30pm, and coming along to Towrang on Thursday 31st October, also at 6:30pm.

Mayoral Emergency Relief Fund

As we get further into spring and closer to summer, the continuing drought is expected to worsen. We had some nice rain (and snow!) in mid-September, but we are certainly desperately in need of further rain.

I want to remind residents of this fund, which was renamed in August but is still able to be utilised for drought relief. All funds have been transferred across, enabling the funds to be utilised for a wider range of events then just the drought. This does not mean funds cannot be used for drought relief, especially if tough conditions continue throughout spring and summer.

The Council decision allows flexibility in using these funds, but they may still be utilised in the coming 6 months for drought relief projects.

Council will need to make a decision on an event by event basis to determine what qualifies for assistance from the Mayoral Emergency Relief Fund.

The application form for relief funds is available to view on Council's website, or can be picked up from the Civic Centre at 184 Bourke St, Goulburn.


We're always on the lookout for good quality second hand books from popular authors so if you have some please donate them all to the Book Exchange.

We were all busy knitting bonnets and booties for donation to hospitals for premmie babies.

Our guest speaker at our September meeting was Tracey Roberts from the Anglicare Goulburn & Yass Homelessness Support Service. Tracey explained to our members that the services Anglicare provides to the community include emergency crisis accommodation, domestic violence support and prompt early-intervention to prevent homelessness. It was unbelievable to hear that one in eight Australians have been homeless at some point in their lives.

We donated two large boxes of food and twelve crocheted rugs, but they are also in desperate need of furniture, bedding, blankets etc. The only articles they are unable to accept are whitegoods.

Southern Tablelands Rail User Group

TrainLink and Transport for NSW management met with Regional Rail Action NSW member groups (of which STRUG is a member) to discuss a number of topics.

Guy Collishaw who is the Director for the new Regional Diesel Fleet Project was there and RRA members were expecting to learn the specifications of the new diesel fleet. Unfortunately Guy was not very forthcoming with this information which failed to impress many RRA members, including STRUG's four representatives. Greg Price, STRUG President, attempted to talk with Guy after lunch before the forum restarted. Guy did say that the new CAF trains have a floor level to the UK height, which is the only place they have been sold to with raised platforms, and that it is higher than NSW platform heights. He said that a power operated step will be deployed when the passenger doors are opened. As regional residents are aware many regional platforms are under the correct height and this may create some problems if his information is correct. Discover Marulan readers may be familiar with the very low height of the Tallong Sydney bound platform. We are a little confused as the CAF web site lists only to floor levels and the highest floor appears to be under height.

STRUG is not happy with the lack of information in the public domain about the new diesel trains and has submitted a list of 19 questions along with a request for a meeting with Peter Allaway, Chief Operating Officer for TrainLink, to discuss Southern Tablelands train services (or lack of them). We hope to be able to get our questions answered and no doubt these answers, if they are forthcoming, will raise some new questions.

We learnt that there are 130 trains a day (65 each way) on the main south line and that passenger trains have to be squeezed in between the freight trains. Fortunately there are not many freight trains in the early hour when our commuter trains depart. The forum was judged to be a useful event and both parties agreed to meet twice a year at least.

By way of contrast, the Victorian government is buying new long distance trains for their north east route, Albury, and they have just conducted consultations with local community groups to determine the internal requirements and these new trains will be built in Victoria keeping the money circulating in the Australian economy instead of overseas economies.







Tallong bids farewell to DAVID LEESE who died on the 29th August 2019. David and wife Christina's early life was spent in North Sydney where they raised their boys, though upon retirement in 1999 they moved to their property in Tallong. Before the move and as preparation for farm life David, studied horticulture and joined up with the permaculture movement. David's



other passion was genealogy, which he was very good at and Tallong's ANZAC ceremonies and historical displays benefited from his expertise. David and Christina were founding members of the TCFG; David at first appointed Vice President then became the second President.

The setting up of the TCFG in 2005 was at a time when Tallong was attracting a larger population (called "newbies" by long time locals), who like Christina and David wanted to give up city life and integrate into a rural community. This widespread phenomenon was later called making a "tree change". Many took up the subdivided lands of older properties like Warrima, Bosworth, Bumballa, Tee Tree and most recently Caoura Station. The creation of Tallong Park Estate also made small acreages available.

This was also a time of change in village life as it was proposed that Goulburn City Council would amalgamate with Mulwaree Shire. Public meetings were held in the Hall about interim measures before the council elections and then how the new council would proceed. Villagers found the new Council "Goulburn Centric" and saw the need to have a stronger voice to speak up about, as they perceived it, Tallong's neglect.

Over the previous century various Progress Associations were formed and provided a voice to lobby and liaise with authorities for improved amenities in Tallong. There seems to have been a thrifty hands on approach as for example the Hall was built as a memorial after the First World War by the villagers themselves. Newspaper reports tell of numerous projects carried out by these associations; planting trees on various Arbor Days, a weather shed built for the school in the 1920s, between 1914 and 1916 requests for a loading bank at the goods siding was successfully forwarded to the Railway Department and a cricket pitch and a

tennis court were provided in the 1930's. Village events were staged; of note "Back to Tallong" celebrated in the 1980s and protesting in the 1960s when the recreation reserve was to be turned into a sanitary dump. By 2004 the association of the time was winding down so in 2005 a public meeting was called to form a new representative group to meet the challenges of changing times.

The new organization, after much discussion, was named Tallong Community Focus Group (TCFG) and the committee proceeded to organize the first Apple Day Festival to be held in 2006. With the intention of building a stronger community the first festival not only honored Tallong's apple growing past it also brought residents together. The first two festivals were staged with the help of the Marulan Lions Club under their insurance policy but it became evident that the group needed to incorporate so that their own insurance could be taken out. David Leese called public meetings to formulate the group's objectives and to forward the process of incorporation. Another project initiated by David was turning the unseemly bush block in the village centre into a native plant reserve. Villages came together to remove rubbish and with the fire brigades help tackled weeds and invasive species that had taken over. Two other projects initiated in this period involved villagers engaging with local artists and Boral to "Paint the Pot" and to write a booklet about the history/heritage of Tallong.


