

Marulan Village Master Plan Update

In late 2017 we held a public meeting in Marulan to discuss the vision and desired future character of the town. Over 50 residents attended the meeting on the night which was a great result in what was the first discussion on a Marulan Village Master Plan.

Staff and the consultant engaged have now gone away and put a 20 year vision together for Marulan, based entirely on what you as a community said was important.

Traffic access to and from the Hume Highway was identified as a key area in making Marulan more attractive to both tourism and drivers wishing to stop for a break. Other ideas and feedback raised on the evening included a need for more facilities for an ageing population, activities and facilities for youth and better working relationships with the surrounding quarries.

A draft of the Master Plan has now been created and we are again seeking to engage with the community to ensure we have got this right. A meeting will be scheduled in late April in Marulan to allow the community the opportunity to go through the document and make sure your vision for the area will be met by the master plan.

Stronger Country Communities Fund

Round two of the NSW Government Stronger Country Communities Fund is now open and Goulburn Mulwaree Council has been allocated \$1.66 million for this round which is a great result.

The fund supports community infrastructure projects, upgrade and refurbishment of local sporting facilities and capital works related to street public place making.

In the past few weeks we have called for project ideas and suggestions from our communities as well as meeting directly with organisations in our rural areas – including Marulan on the 26th March. We will be considering a report on all projects put forward in early April and then deciding which ones we will promote to the NSW Government for grant funding.

One of Council's priorities for this round of the Stronger Country Communities Fund is ensuring that each rural village receives a share of this funding for a community project so keep an eye out for further detail!

Ray Harvey Sports Foundation Grants

Nominations for round 2 of the Ray Harvey Sports Foundation Grants (2017/18) are now open. The foundation is named after the late Ray Harvey who contributed greatly to many sport and community activities throughout the region.

The foundation seeks to support promising young sportspeople, helping them financially with coaching fees and providing assistance with costs associated with competition outside the local government area.

I'd encourage any junior athletes in Marulan who need support for their representative sporting efforts to make an application. Grant application forms are available on Council's website or from Customer Service in the Civic Centre (184 Bourke Street Goulburn). April President's Report



Council has informed the HASP Project Committee that the project in its present form cannot be supported by council. Instead, the project needs to be included in the Village Plan which is yet to be completed.

The HASP project had been accumulating the Discretionary Village Funds with a view to securing matching grants. However given the above Council decision, these funds are now free to be spent on community projects.

Council has approached community representatives to discuss the use of these discretionary funds together with a grant application that Council is putting together based on the State's Stronger Communities Fund.

At a meeting with Council's General Manager, two projects were put forward to be funded by the grant together with the use of the discretionary fund:

- 1. The internal revamping of the toilet block in Tony Onions Park and building a new complex
- 2. The conversion of the stairs leading from George street to Post Office Lane to be converted into disabled access ramps

The Chamber will be writing to all community groups to seek ideas for other projects which benefit the community as a whole so that existing and future village funds can be allocated to the projects that most groups want. When the Chamber receives answers from the groups, the projects will be publicised and completed as village funds accumulate.

To date some of the suggestions have been dishwashers in the hall, a projector and screen in the hall, and better lighting outside the hall.

When all suggestions have been received, the community will be given a chance to view them and comment on the list.

To all the community groups who took part in the HASP project, it is far from dead. Boral have committed with Council's consent to clear the HASP site. The plan is still viable. It only means a different road to the same destination. Your work in getting the HASP project to its present position is appreciated and will be the basis for Council to progress the project.

What is the Marulan Progress Association

The history and commencement of the Marulan Progress Association began in 1880-81 with the aim to gain improvements in services and to lobby local government issues.

The association had lobbied for street lighting, which has had recent success in Stoney Creek Rd. Better footpaths, tree planting, sporting facilities and of course better roads

One project in 2008-11 was to have installed a school crossing. and in the same year we successfully lobbied for a Police Officer to be stationed in Marulan.

During the past 138 years some of the other projects have been the lobbying for electricity to our village (1838), the water supply officially connected in 1969 and the railway bridge foot crossing which was met with outstanding success.

The very first 'Marulan Magazine' was written by the then Secretary of the Progress Association Mrs Alison Sieler (1995). Although editors and ownerships have come and gone the magazine is still produced today thanks to the instigation of the Progress Association.

The Meridian Arch and Park is another of the Progress Associations work. Recently a world map 'Dome' has been



added to further enhance the Arch costing more than \$13,000

Following a suggestion by Helen Cousins, the idea of a monument to demonstrate the significance of Marulan being the only town in the world situated on the 150th Meridian, the Progress Association went into overdrive and chose Sebastian Meijbaums design to create the now famous sculpture the 'Meridian Arch'. The Meridian Park was officially opened by the Progress President John Nicastri and Mayor Paul Stephenson on the 26th October 2003

Monthly meetings are now held at 107 George Street Marulan on the third Monday of each month at 5.30. All are welcome.

MARULAN VOLUNTEERS

Who are we? We are a group of local residents trying to improve the appearance of our town.

Why do we do this? If our town looks appealing and cared for, this will attract visitors who will support our local businesses. It also makes it a better environment for us to live in as locals.

What do we do? Local council mows the town's parks and some of its nature strips, but doesn't have the resources to do much more than this. The volunteers supplement the work of council by regularly cutting the edges and whipper snipping the main street and parks. We also weed the gardens in the parks, and collect litter in areas around town. Other less frequent and one-off activities have included: refurbishing the grounds at the Brewer Centre; mulching the gardens in Meridian Park; repairing and painting roadside fences in the main street; and repairing and painting the fence & rotunda in Tony Onions Park.

How often do we do it? Generally speaking, the volunteers work for 2-3 hours on the first and third Monday (starting approximately 9.30am) of each month.



News from Barber's Creek.

One hundred and fifty years ago, in August 1868, the Main Southern Railway was opened as far as Marulan. The project was a major one for the development of NSW and as such progress by the contractors was reported in the major newspapers of the day. Thus on 1st February 1868, The Sydney Morning Herald reported that "The wrought iron bridge over Barber's Creek is finished".

The bridge consisted of five 60 foot (18.3 m) spans supported on piers and abutments made of "dressed sandstone blocks laid in Portland cement". Each span comprised two wrought iron girders 4 feet 7 inches (140 cm) deep and 13 feet (4m) apart connected by a number of cross girders.



With the building of the railway line and bridge, the population of Barber's Creek was swollen temporarily by the establishment of a railway camp to house workers. A description of the situation in 1914 (during duplication works) can give some idea of what it was probably like in the 1860s as well: "...men brought their wives and children. Tents and all the gear needed for the works were also brought. They had a blacksmith's shop near it too, and tents were everywhere. They called it 'Calico Town'". The men working on the viaduct built a bark school house suitable (they said) for 40 children, located a suitable teacher and petitioned the Board of National Education for a salary to pay him. After further enquiry, this was granted and school books were also provided. The school teacher in the meantime was conducting an evening school for the benefit of some of the workmen. This school is believed to have closed after completion of the viaduct and the closing of the railway camp.

The Tallong community will be joining with the Marulan and District Historical Society to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the opening of the railway line from Moss Vale to Marulan in August 2018.

Two Hundred Years Since the First Official European Exploration.

The passage of the Survey Expedition led by James Meehan through the Tallong area in March 1818 was celebrated over the weekend of 24th-25th March 2018.

On Saturday, in Tallong Memorial Hall, approximately 100 people enjoyed supper and complimentary wine provided by the Marulan and District Historical Society with a talk on the significance of the Expedition provided by Margaret Botticchio.

On Sunday, the village and its surroundings were open for inspection with bus tours available and displays at the RFS shed and St Stephen's Church. Watling's Apple Shed was also open showing the apple sorting equipment. Tallong Rural Fire Brigade and the Tallong Community Focus Group combined to provide a delicious lunch.

The Anzac Day service at Tallong will be held at the Tallong War Memorial, Memorial Drive, Tallong at 10am on 25th April 2018.





The Garden Guru



The Creative Cook



We are well into autumn now. Leaves will be colouring to lovely shades of orange, red and yellow then falling from deciduous trees. Some early frosts will also cool our mornings. Now is the time to visit our local nurseries and garden centres to view the deciduous trees in their autumn glory. This is the time to pick one out while they are in colour.

It is time to prepare for frosty weather by covering those frost tender plants. If plants are hit by frost do not trim off any damages parts until spring. The damages foliage will help protect the plants from further damage.



Keep gardens weeded and cultivate between vegetable rows to keep down annual weeds. Don't mow lawns too short now as growth will slow down now, and weeds will encroach on bare spots. Try and keep on top of garden pests such as snails, aphids and caterpillars.



Plant your winter vegetable garden this month. This will give the plants and seeds a good start before winter is upon us. April is a great planting month for both plants and gardeners. Container plants can be re-potted into larger pots or in the garden. Rejuvenate existing pots by adding a top layer of potting mix plus a small amount of compost. Check that drainage holes are clear.

April can be a busy month and rewarding month in the garden.

Zucchini and Sundried Tomato Slices

A perfect autumn recipe that is so easy to make, really tasty and versatile. It's great hot or cold. Perfect for school lunches or a light brunch or dinner.

Ingredients:

- 2 zucchini, grated
- 1 large onion finely chopped
- ½ cup sundried tomatoes drained, sliced
- 1 cup tasty cheese grated
- 1 cup self-raising flour
- ½ cup oil
- 5 eggs
- salt/pepper

Directions:

- Preheat oven to 170°C.
- Grease and line a non-stick baking pan.
- Combine zucchini, onion, sundried tomatoes, flour and cheese in a large bowl.
- Add oil and lightly beaten eggs. Combine.
- Season with a little salt and pepper. Pour into non-stick baking pan.
- Bake for 35-40 mins until golden and set.
- Allow to cool slightly before slicing.

A Fire Permit is required for burning activities during the Bush Fire Danger Period which is now active.

Fire Permits help ensure fire is used safely and minimise the danger to you, your property and the community.




