Focusing on sustainability

In late September Council moved to proceed with installation of a 45KW solar power system on the new warehouse building at Council's Operations Centre in Hetherington Street.

The project aligns with Council's Sustainability Action Plan which sets out achievable and measureable actions to undertake to improve environmental sustainability of operations.

The move comes as part of the Depot consolidation project which has relocated the storage warehouse and Operations staff into the one facility to increase efficiencies. The solar power generated on site will be used directly for operational requirements, with surplus power generated to be fed back into the electricity grid.

In 2016 Council built a new amenities building at the Marulan Waste Centre that is completely 'off-the-grid.' It is powered entirely by a solar power system complete with cutting edge Lithium Ion batteries to provide electricity for air conditioning, amenities and computers.

\$1.5 million has also been allocated in the 4 year delivery program for design and construction of a Solar Farm at the Marulan Wastewater Treatment Plant. We are currently advertising for a feasibility study that will investigate this project along the viability of biogas renewable energy, and installation of solar panels on other Council buildings.

New outdoor equipment at Meridian Park

In early September I had the pleasure of attending the opening of the outdoor play equipment at the Meridian Park in Marulan. This work was instigated by the Lions Club of Marulan in conjunction with funding from the Veolia Mulwaree Trust and Goulburn Mulwaree Council. The Lions Club are to be congratulated for their initiative and effort in pulling this project together.

This will be a great addition to the community facilities in Marulan, and is contributing to the continuing enhancement of the Meridian Park precinct. Well done!





A Rock and Roll extravaganza was held at the Hall on the 23rd of September. A great night was had by all. This was held on the equinox to celebrate our place on the 150th meridian and as a lead up to our annual Kite Festival. Various Chamber members sponsored the night including: Marulan Truck and Bus who sponsored the band; the Marulan General Store who donated lucky door prizes; and other local businesses who donated for the auction.

An excellent meal was cooked and served by Marulan Butchery. Yvonne, a qualified chef, provided a banquet for the guests.

As reported in last month's Discover Marulan Newsletter, the Chamber was invited to meet with representatives of the State Government regarding an allocation of \$1.3 billion to Regional NSW infrastructure programs. Stephen James and I spent an hour with them discussing: a southern exit out of Marulan; rail transport solutions for quarries; and required improvements to passenger rail services. The Government will prepare a report in the next three to four months and we will further discuss with them and advocate on behalf of our town.

I urge people to attend the next Council Outreach meeting in Marulan. It is on the 24th October at 6.30pm. Supper will be on offer by the CWA.

It is important to attend as it provides you an opportunity to address any issues you have with the Council; good or bad. All Councillors, many Directors and the General Manager will be attending so if you have questions about rates, water, roads or other things that affect the town or where you live, this is an opportunity to raise them with the people who make the decisions.

Who are we? We are a group of local residents trying to improve the appearance of our town.

Winter, Wonders or Woes.

Looking back over the last few months one encounters mixed opinions about how cold this winter was in Tallong. Historical rainfall records and weather observations from the Caoura locality dating back to 1919 show those snowfalls have not been uncommon. Snow which settled on the ground was reported 8 or 9 times during the 20th century with one record snowfall of 6" (150mm) on 4th September 1931. The most recent major fall appears to have been in 1962.





This winter, however, has been very dry, with many frosts and fine sunny days. Monthly rainfalls for July, August and September, recorded by the rain gauges on various properties around Tallong, are significantly lower than the average monthly rainfall readings. Local resident and retired meteorologist, Geoff Clark, has produced a report showing that overall, the 2017 winter rainfall totals were from 45 to 57% lower than the longer term averages with the monthly total rainfall for July 2017 being from 5 to 48% lower than the longer term averages across the network of stations.

Historically, while winter does tend to be one of the driest seasons here, there is usually a peak in mean monthly rainfall figures in June, which did not occur this year. Previous years, have also shown another smaller peak in rainfall during October/ November which everyone will be hoping will happen this year. Otherwise it will be a long summer with little growth in pastures or gardens, low water levels in tanks and dams, and higher than usual risk of fires.

Geoff also reported that the number of frost nights in 2017, as measured at his home observatory, though relatively high was considerably fewer than in 2015. Thirty five frost nights were recorded over July, August and September 2017 with an average frost temperature of -1.8°C. After collating 6 years of observations, he found that the average daily minimum temperature in 2017 was the equal lowest and the average daily maximum the equal highest. It is noteworthy that the Bureau of Meteorology observations across Australia has reported that overall, the winter national mean temperature has been very much above average with exceptionally warm daytime temperatures for Australia.

Geoff Clark's 'Winter 2017' report can be read in its entirety on the Tallong website www.tallong.com.au together with an even more comprehensive 2014 report 'Weather in the Tallong Region'.

In winter we all stick close to the warmth of home so with warmer weather approaching the Tallong Community Focus Group decided to hold their AGM on the 24th October, 2017 at 7pm in the Tallong Memorial Hall. At the conclusion of AGM business a light supper will be served.



The Garden Guru



The weather is getting warmer with the start of daylight saving. The extra time in the evenings is great for getting out in the garden.

Once frosts have finished you can remove any frost damaged growth.

If azalea and camellia have finished flowering they should be fertilised with a liquid fertiliser. Camellias can be clipped to retain their shape.



Summer flowering annuals can be planted for summer flowering. Zinnia, phlox, verbena and petunia can be planted out or raised from seed. They also do well in pots, hanging baskets and raised garden beds. Pelargoniums and geraniums also give a good display of colour and are also quite drought tolerant. They are very easy to grow from cuttings.



Be water wise when planting your garden. Water in the early morning or early evening. Where water is an ongoing problem, incorporate plants with low water needs such as agapanthus, succulents and geraniums. Also sprinkle soil wetter on the gardens which allows the water to soak in thoroughly. Place mulch around your plants to help retain moisture

The Creative Cook



Homemade Applesauce

There are lots of recipes that call for "applesauce". For those of us who like to DIY, or those who don't like the commercial ones that are a bit too sweet, here's a simple recipe that produces great results.

Ingredients:

- 4 apples (peeled, cored and chopped)
- 3/4 cup water
- $1\!\!\!/_4$ cup sugar (or less if you don't like too much sweetness)
- 1/4 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

Directions:

Combine apples, water, sugar, ginger, nutmeg and cinnamon in a saucepan.

Cover, and cook over medium heat for 15 to 20 minutes, or until the apples soften. Occasionally stir.

Allow to cool, then mash with a fork or potato masher.

You can freeze any excess applesauce

This exhibition will reveal sculptures that represent a liminal space between a sense of place and one of being lost. Scott Chaseling will present art works relating to Heterotopia (a place between Utopia and Dystopia).
