The Terminus Hotel

It would seem that 'The Terminus' was established as a hotel in the early 1860s prior to the opening of the railway in 1868, making it one of the longest continuously trading hotels in rural NSW.

In 1867 an advertisement in the Sydney Morning Herald offering land for sale at Mooroooolen (original name of Marulan) shows the Terminus in operation.

At the turn of the century when all licences were recalled by the Government, only one permit was issued in Marulan - to the Terminus. It was rumoured that the reason the Terminus was selected for the licence was because the licensee was a member of that parliament.

Fire & Emergency Services Levy deferred indefinitely

In June council was notified by the NSW Government of the indefinite deferral of the Fire and Emergency Services Levy (FESL) which was to be introduced on Council Rates from July 1, 2017.

The NSW Government has deferred the introduction of the FESL to ensure small to medium businesses do not face an unreasonable burden in their contribution to the State's fire and emergency services, Premier Gladys Berejiklian and Treasurer Dominic Perrottet announced today.

The Fire and Emergency Services Levy will continue to be collected via insurance policies until the NSW Government has completed its review of the policy, and the funding requirements of fire and emergency services agencies will be met in full

Goulburn Mulwaree Council's focus is now on the 2017/18 rates notices, and we will endeavour to provide our community with up-to-date information as it comes to light.

Rocky Hill Museum concept revealed

The concept plans for expansion of the Rocky Hill War Memorial Museum were revealed in June, following an expression of interest process held earlier this year.

Sydney based firm Crone Architects have created a concept that is modern and innovative, while being sympathetic to the surrounding landscape, the war memorial and the existing museum building.

The design incorporates contrasting materials of glass, stainless steel and textured concrete which is pigmented to reference the tone of the Memorial Tower. The stainless steel cladding reflects the unique natural landscape of Rocky Hill and also reinforces the idea of Rocky hill as a place for reflection.

Concept designs for the extension would double the current display, exhibition and storage space, allowing for larger school and touring groups who are interested in visiting the museum, as well as touring exhibitions from other museums to be displayed in Goulburn.

Adding services to Big READ Bus

Goulburn Mulwaree Council is trialling a new service with the Big READ Bus, our well-loved mobile library van.

Members of Council's Customer Service team will be getting out of the office and onto the Big READ Bus each month to offer services to our regional communities in their own towns.

Along with the normal range of Library services, customer service team members will be able to undertake payments and transactions (cheques and EFTPOS only at this time) as well as lodge service requests. This will allow our community members who may typically have difficulties getting into the Civic Centre in Goulburn to lodge requests.

As reported in last month's Discover Marulan, the Chamber presented a submission to Council for their consideration in the 2017/18 Budget.

This referred to three areas;

1. Water quality in Marulan
2. Inadequate lighting in George Street
3. Better maintenance and upkeep of the Village

This submission went to a full Council meeting on 6/6/17 for consideration by councillors and their decisions to the matters raised is in the reply published in the following pages.

Action from the submission was fairly swift. Chamber has met with two Council officers from Parks and Recreation a week ago. Early outcomes from that meeting are;

1. Council will develop a maintenance plan for Marulan and will seek input from us
2. Two new waste bins have been installed
3. Two vandalised trees in the main street have been replaced
4. In the next month tree planting will continue down the length of Brayton Rd and each year trees will be proliferated throughout Marulan

The Chamber also needs to make comment on false, exaggerated and divisive information peddled by some; stating that Holcim's Johnniefields site would be home to composting and building waste being deposited in the void left by the Quarry.

Holcim holds a 30 year lease on the Brayton Rd site and remediation and rehabilitation of the site has not been decided as yet.

The Chamber has put forward a proposal to Holcim that the pit could be turned into a water filled recreational asset for the use of the residents to picnic, boat and swim. Holcim has stated this proposal will be considered by the company as a possible solution.

**Subject: Submission to Draft 2017–2021 Delivery Program and
Draft 2017-2018 Operational Plan**

Thank you for your submission to Council's Draft 2017-2021 Delivery Program and Draft 2017-18 Operational Plan.

Your submission was addressed by Council at its Meeting held on Tuesday 6 June 2017.

Council resolved the following:

"That:

- A. The submission from the Marulan Region Chamber of Commerce be received and noted.*
- B. No changes be made to the Operational and Delivery Plans as a result of this submission*
- C. Council staff liaise with members of the Marulan Region Chamber of Commerce to discuss how maintenance within the Marulan township can best be achieved within the existing budget*
- D. Council note that the Marulan Region Chamber of Commerce have been advised that the street lights in question have been repaired.*
- E. The Marulan Region Chamber of Commerce be advised of the initiatives in the Delivery Plan 2017/18 – 2020/21 in relation to Water and Waste Water".*

In relation to Part E of the resolution please be advised of the following:

Council has invested significant funds into new and refurbished water infrastructure in Marulan over the last 10 years. These include new Water Treatment Plant membranes, amenities and plant upgrade, refurbishment of Medway Reservoir, several hundred metres of reticulated water mains and upgraded telemetry systems. These have gone a long way to improving the performance of the Marulan water network.

With regard to health and safety of residents, Council has continual monitoring and operational programs to ensure the system meets the Australian Drinking Water Guidelines and our licence requirements. Council responds immediately to water quality complaints to ensure we are meeting our approved levels of service. The Marulan Water Treatment Plant produces water that meets the Australian Drinking Water Guidelines. If at times during severe storm events and the plant cannot provide the high water quality required Council issues boil water alerts, water flushing programs and further performance monitoring to protect the health of residents.

In addition to the above, Council will be delivering new and refurbished water and sewer infrastructure over the next 10 years with expenditure amounts never before seen for utilities in the Marulan township. These include:

- New wastewater treatment plant - \$7.35M – Commence 2018/19 and completion 20/21
- New Water Treatment Plant - \$7.8M – Commence 2020/21 completion 22/23
- Marulan WTP rising main - \$450k over 3 years from 2018/19 – 2020/21
- New river pump station pontoon in 20/21 \$300k
- Marulan WTP new balance tank access, platforms - \$50k in 2017/18
- Marulan WTP membrane replacements - \$150k in 2018/19
- High Lift pump station upgrade - \$60k in 2020/21
- New West Marulan Reservoir and rising main - \$4.5M in 2021/22.

The new Water and Wastewater treatment plants are significant investments and will be designed to be best practice facilities to enable growth in the township for many years to come. The reason these 2 projects are not commencing until 2018/19 is a resourcing and funding issue to allow Council to complete the \$30M Goulburn Wastewater treatment Plant project currently under construction – which was a requirement of our EPA licence.

I believe that in relation to Part C of the resolution, discussion between yourself and members of Council staff have already commenced and will be ongoing over the coming months.

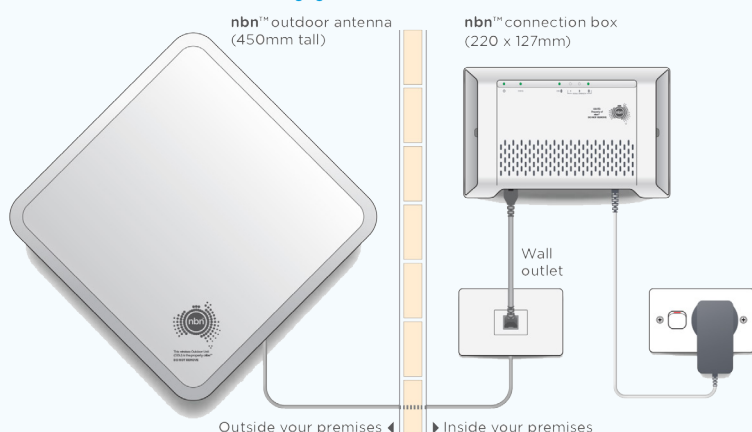

The technology that will be used for the NBN in Marulan is Fixed Wireless

This type of connection is typically used in circumstances where the distance between premises can be many kilometres. In this circumstance data travels from a transmission tower located in the Marulan town to a rooftop antenna at your premises that has been fitted by an approved nbn™ Installer.



Fixed wireless connections also require an nbn™ network device to be installed at the point where the cable from the roof antenna enters your home. This device requires power to operate, and can only be installed by an approved nbn™ Installer or service provider.

We will keep you up to date on the progress of the rollout but the current plan is to have it up and running in mid 2018.

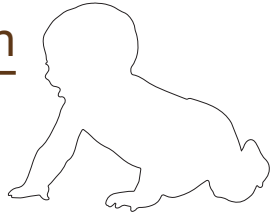

A Store Makes a Village

A general store is always a great community asset for a village to possess. Tallong is fortunate that, apart from about 20 years, a general store has existed on much the same site, at the corner of what is now Caoura Rd. and Highland Way, since the early 1890s.

Albert and Harry Davenport built the first store in 1892. A description by Bill Davenport, published in the 'Barber's Creek News' in 1981, is very evocative: 'It was a common sight to see people arriving with their bullock teams purchasing sacks of flour, produce and groceries. Everything was sold, English cups and saucers, plates and cutlery. China was imported in large barrels holding a gross of each.

Spectacles came in boxes and a customer would keep trying them on until a pair was found that suited. These would cost 2 shillings. Drapery, groceries and ingredients for making spirits illegally were also sold...A licence was also held for buying gold, paying bounty on dingo and wombat scalps and other animal skins...'



The Davenports were also great community builders, agitating for a Community Hall and providing the land, selling land to the Department of Education for the Public School as well as providing a teacher's residence so the village could attract a married teacher. The first store, made of galvanised iron, was replaced with a brick structure in 1926 with a house being added in 1930.

After Harry Davenport's death in 1932, the store was leased to Messrs Johnston and Luke and Mr and Mrs Cologon among others, continuing the role as a community focus point until tragically the building burned down in the 1965 Chatsbury bushfire.

The Tallong General Store was not rebuilt until the 1990s and although it does not carry the same range of products as it did in the early twentieth century, it still serves as a valuable village hub and the community has been most fortunate that the current owners, Helene and Peter O'Shaughnessy, and their staff have been so keen to maintain a caring community spirit.

However now it comes time to say 'farewell' and 'thank you' to Helene and Peter as they have sold the business and are moving interstate to be closer to family. Many residents are unaware of how much quiet support they have given the village, from making salads and slices for the village Christmas parties to providing noticeboards for village information and a venue for the sale of raffle tickets for the P&C and for the provision of all the information regarding Apple Day. We wish them and all their staff – Cheryl, Fran, Noeline and Joan – well and welcome the new owners who will have big shoes to fill.



Regional News (in brief)



30 May - Goulburn Mulwaree Council has been declared Fit for the Future, after submitting for reassessment in November last year. The assessment was based upon Council's reassessment proposal and the recently completed Long Term Financial Plan which sets out a clear outline for the next ten years for the region.

7 June - Goulburn Mulwaree Council awarded the tender for construction and landscaping for the Adventure Playground, appointing Landform Gardens to undertake this exciting project.

13 June - The concept plans for expansion of the Rocky Hill War Memorial Museum have been revealed. The design incorporates contrasting materials of glass, stainless steel and textured concrete which is pigmented to reference the tone of the Memorial Tower.

20 June - Last year's highly successful Country Road Safety campaign is being launched in its second iteration, with new partners coming on board to support the important message.

23 June - Five Landscape Architecture students from the University of Canberra have presented their final design concepts for the Wollondilly and Mulwaree Rivers, centred on the River Walkway.

26 June - Goulburn Mulwaree Council began using a new innovative green waste pad at the Goulburn Waste Management Centre. The compost area will reduce the time taken to breakdown food and organic waste, creating a mulch product within 14 weeks.

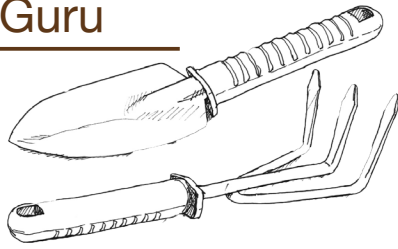

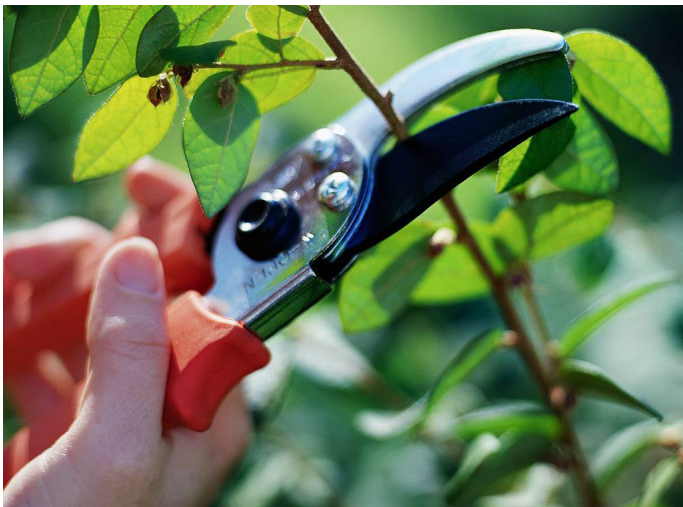


The Garden Guru



Winter is 'still' here

We are well into winter now. A range of plants can be pruned at the end of the month or early August. Do not prune spring-flowering, deciduous shrubs and flowering fruit trees grown for ornamental blossom. Remove all dead wood. Spray all rose bushes immediately after pruning and the soil under the plants to clear up fungus spores.



Check deciduous trees for borer and treat with a low-toxic insecticide. Remove all spent flower heads from bulbs. Remember to cover vulnerable plants to protect them from the frosts. Any foliage damaged by frosts should be left to be removed in the warmer weather.

Now is the time to think about drought-tolerant plants for your gardens. Some species are the oleander, photinia, pomegranate, the humble lemon, agave, geranium and iris, to name a few. They are very hardy and survive neglect and little water once established. July can be more suitable for armchair gardening. Find a warm spot and look up catalogues and gardening books. Plan your spring garden.

Fluffy Banana Pancakes

What could be better than light, fluffy, deliciously warm pancakes on a winter's weekend morning. Here's a really easy-peasy recipe for the yummiest pancakes ever! What's more, it's gluten free, low carb and high in protein.

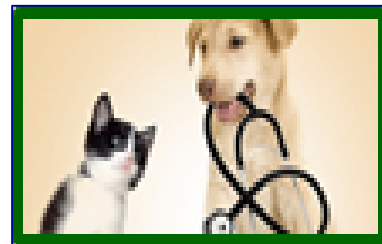
Ingredients

- 1 banana (medium, mashed)
- 2 eggs (large)
- 1/4 cup almond meal
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder (optional)

Method

1. Mix all ingredients together, making sure to get rid of any lumps.
2. Heat a pan over medium heat and spray with non-stick cooking spray.
3. Pour batter onto pan (about 2 tablespoons per pancake). The batter will be a little bit thinner than normal pancakes, so you don't need as much to make one pancake.
4. Cook for about a minute, and then flip. Cook for an additional minute on the other side.
