

COVID-19 Response

Goulburn Mulwaree Council is continuing to prioritise essential services for our community throughout the evolving Coronavirus COVID-19 situation. *Please note that this column was written on the 2nd of April, and as we all know this is an evolving situation, however I think it's important to provide a full picture of where we are at as of the 2/4/2020:*

From the 2nd April, <u>Marulan Waste Management Centre</u> will only be open from 12:30pm to 4pm on Thursday and Saturday each week. We hope residents will be understanding and patient, as we seek to adapt our services to ensure they can continue to be provided.

Goulburn Waste Management Centre will still be operating but with reduced hours. It is closed to the public each Monday, Thursday and Sunday, and will now be open on Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday from 8am – 2pm only.

We have realigned our waste team, who will now work split shifts to ensure decontamination can occur between staff changeovers. These measures are designed to help ensure we can continue to provide all waste services, including collections, at this difficult time.

A number of Council facilities are now closed to the public:

- Goulburn Mulwaree Library (including the Mobile Library)
- Goulburn Aquatic & Leisure Centre
- Goulburn Regional Art Gallery
- Rocky Hill War Memorial Museum
- Goulburn Community Centre
- Goulburn Historic Waterworks Museum
- Visitor Information Centre

We are also closing a number of public toilet facilities. The below toilets will remain open:

- Belmore Park
- Marsden Weir
- O'Brien Park
- Eastgrove South
- Tony Onions Park (Marulan)
- Tarago Park
- Tallong Park

Unfortunately we have also had to close all playgrounds following this week's announcement by the Prime Minister. Open spaces will continue to be accessible, but play equipment must no longer be used and gathering areas (e.g. Adventure Playground, Skate Park, Rage Cage and Outdoor Gyms) can no longer be used.

The <u>Goulburn Mulwaree Animal Shelter</u> will not be undertaking normal opening hours, but will be responding to requests as usual. Pick up of animals can be done by appointment only.

Goulburn Mulwaree Council's main priority is the continuation of essential services. A list of these have been identified, and this will include water, wastewater, waste collection, cemeteries and environmental health along with on-call services.

Please listen to local radio on Monday, Wednesday and Friday morning's where I'll be providing updates on 1368 2GN at 8:10am, and 93.5 Eagle FM after 8:30am. I'd also advise you to monitor the <u>Goulburn Mulwaree Council Facebook Page</u> and website for further information.

Please look after each other, and follow the Federal Government <u>guidelines on social distancing</u> and <u>hygiene</u> seriously. It is going to be a testing period in our lives over the coming weeks and likely months, and it is essential that each individual and family does their bit to avoid spreading this virus.

I also recognise that many people have lost or are facing losing their jobs. The economic impact is also enormous, and my heart goes out to our community members who will lose work and income through no fault of their own. Please take advantage of government assistance that is being made available. I'm confident Goulburn Mulwaree can rebuild when this is all over, and will do so by supporting each other.





WEATHER WATCH

Weather-wise things have improved with the soil now wonderfully easy to work with after a generous proportion of rain - We can hear the farmers say "Yes, but we need more!" Indeed we do, but still what we've had has been very welcome and with the days becoming cooler it very pleasant outside.





ORGANIC PEST RECIPES SNAIL REMOVER:

1 part Expresso Coffee x 5 parts water. Mix 100ml of coffee x 5 parts with 1L of water in a spray bottle to get rid of snails. Spray well. May need to spray more than once..

RECIPÉ TO ERADICATE WHITE CURL GRUBS:

1 part household detergent x 5 parts water. 100ml of detergent mixed with 1I of water in a spray bottle will get red of white curl grubs which live in the lawn & sometimes in pots too. Spray well.

FLOWERS FOR BUTTERFLIES & BEES ...

Michaelmas daisies (pictured at right) are among the asters which are more resistant to mildew but delightful for butterflies. Butterflies also like Honesty, Oregano flowers and Hebes.

Bees on the other hand love Dog Roses,
Honeysuckle, Candytuft and verbena. These are
just a few of the bee loving plants.
Plants such as the many species of native paper

Plants such as the many species of native paper daisies attract beneficial insects and butterflies to the garden and native animals such as Echnidas, consume ants but also some pest species.


A GREAT RECYCLING HINT FROM A LOCAL RESIDENT

Keep all your plastic bottle tops. Pop them in a bag, & take them down to **MARULAN RURAL SUPPLIES** where they are picked up & recycled to make prosthetic limbs and spectacle frames.









KEEPING THE ORGANIC GARDEN HEALTHY

A number of techniques can be used by organic gardeners to ensure that pests stay below an acceptable level.

KEEPING the garden clean and tidy is a good start.

REMOVE anything which is pest-infected rather than leaving it in the garden.

PLANT CHOICE choose plants that are suited to the Marulan region's climate. When buying plants make sure they are healthy and are not harbouring pests

RESISTANCE Certain varieties of plants have been bred for their resistance to some pests and diseases. None are completely immune, nevertheless, some resistance can be invaluable.

MIXED PLANTING Mixed planting can look very attractive & the variety of plants can deter pests.

PLANTS TO ATTRACT BENEFICIAL INSECTS

Big, bold open centred flowers such as gaillardias that guide the insects to the centre. Open-centred annuals with a long flowering period, such as the poached-egg flower.





Sports Shed Project

Towards the end of 2018, due to events relating to a medical emergency, our previous sports shed was damaged and had to be dismantled and removed by Mr Divall as it was no longer considered safe. This meant all sporting equipment had to be stored in a different location and was not as easily accessible to students and teachers.

Spray eggplant with cooking spray. Cook eggplant on a heated grill plate (or BBQ, or, cook in single layers in frypan) until browned lightly on both sides. Meanwhile combine yoghurt, mint and 2T water in a small bowl. Serve eggplant sprinkled with tomato. Serve dressing Separately.

1 x ready made sweet pastry shell* 2 cups ready made vanilla custard 2 cups mixed berries, fresh or frozen 1T icing sugar.

Bake the tart shell in the oven using the instructions on the packet. Cool completely Spoon vanilla custard into tart shell and top with the berry mixture. Sprinkle with icing sugar & serve.

Cancellations, Postponements and Closures:

It is with great regret that due to on-going restrictions imposed due to the COVID-19 epidemic:

- The Tallong Community Focus Group has cancelled the ANZAC Day Service that was to be held at the Tallong War Memorial on 25 April 2020. The Focus Group wishes to notify local community groups that they are welcome to lay wreaths or bunches of flowers on the War Memorial but are asked to make sure that social distancing protocols are observed.
- The Tallong Community Resilience Celebration which was to follow the ANZAC Day Service 2020, incorporating the centenary celebration for the Tallong War Memorial Hall with our acknowledgement of the enormous efforts of the Rural Fire Service men and women during the summer, has been postponed. Hopefully this event will take place later in the year.
- Tallong War Memorial Hall and Tallong War Memorial Park have both been closed by the NSW Dept of Lands until further notice. All activities that use the Hall are therefore cancelled as well as the use of the children's playground. Goulburn-Mulwaree Council have closed the public toilets in the Park.
- Tallong RFS has discontinued training and all meetings. The AGM has been postponed to a date to be fixed. The first response team will still attend emergencies. Any emergencies please dial 000.
- Services will not be held at St. Stephens Anglican Church, Tallong until further notice.
- Divergent Church, Tallong gatherings have been cancelled until further notice. However, the leaders, Magnus and Bel Agren, are encouraging "online" connecting through the Divergent Church Tallong Facebook page.
- The Midge, Tallong will maintain its normal hours with the store open but serving take-away food only (no eat in).
 However, Friday night pizza night will be temporarily discontinued with the day-time menu available only. The Midge's famous jams, condiments, biscuits and other goodies as well as an expanded range of frozen meals will still be available.
- Please also note that Apple Day, on 3 May 2020 was cancelled in January due to organisational problems arising from the bush fires.

Bearing in mind the need at the moment to restrict travel where possible, it is worth a smile to remember the difficulties overcome in times gone by. In August 1918, Mary Sparks was the first bride to marry in Tallong's Methodist Church when she married John Hamilton of Cowra. Mary's home was only 6 miles (10 kms) as the crow flies from the church but unfortunately



on the other side of the Shoalhaven Gorge. This was no problem for the bride who rode across, although there were some concerns that if it rained the Shoalhaven River would flood, making the river impassable. These concerns were well founded, in fact, as a few years later her brother drowned when his horse was swept away as he was returning home.

However, the bride's mother described as being "not in robust health" could not attempt the short cut. The only alternative was a buggy ride to Nowra via Nerriga of 60 miles (about 100kms) where she caught the train to Sydney a distance of about 90 miles (about 150 kms). Then she caught the train from Sydney to Tallong (about another 180 kms), with as the Scrutineer and Berrima District Press reported: "... a return journey as a treat in store when the wedding was over"!
