Come and celebrate Australia Day at the Tony Onions Park, George Street, Marulan on Thursday 26 January 2017. The celebrations commence at 9 am with a procession. The Official Ceremony starts at 10 am with Marulan's Australia Day Ambassador, Sam Bailey.

Sam is a farmer, pilot, husband, best selling author and inspirational speaker. He has achieved all of those from a wheelchair....and has an incredible ability to take an audience on the journey of his life.

From a childhood growing up in the Australian bush to a car accident in the outback that turned his life upside down and its aftermath, Sam tells his story in his own down-to-earth laconic style that captures the great Australian spirit of "having a go".

He relates how he beat the odds to fulfil his life-long dream to be a farmer, learning to ride a four-wheel bike; devising a hoist to get into farm machinery and ultimately learning to fly an ultralight.

Sam then found his soul mate in former Tamworth-based ABC radio Rural Reporter, Jenny Black – who he proposed to "live" on regional radio. The real-life proposal jammed the phone lines and the fax ran out of paper.

Their story appeared on ABC TV's "Australian Story" in 2000 with an overwhelming response and was published in April 2006 in their book "Head Over Heels".

Today they live and work together on their beef cattle property in North West NSW, in between travelling the country telling their story and giving inspiration to others.

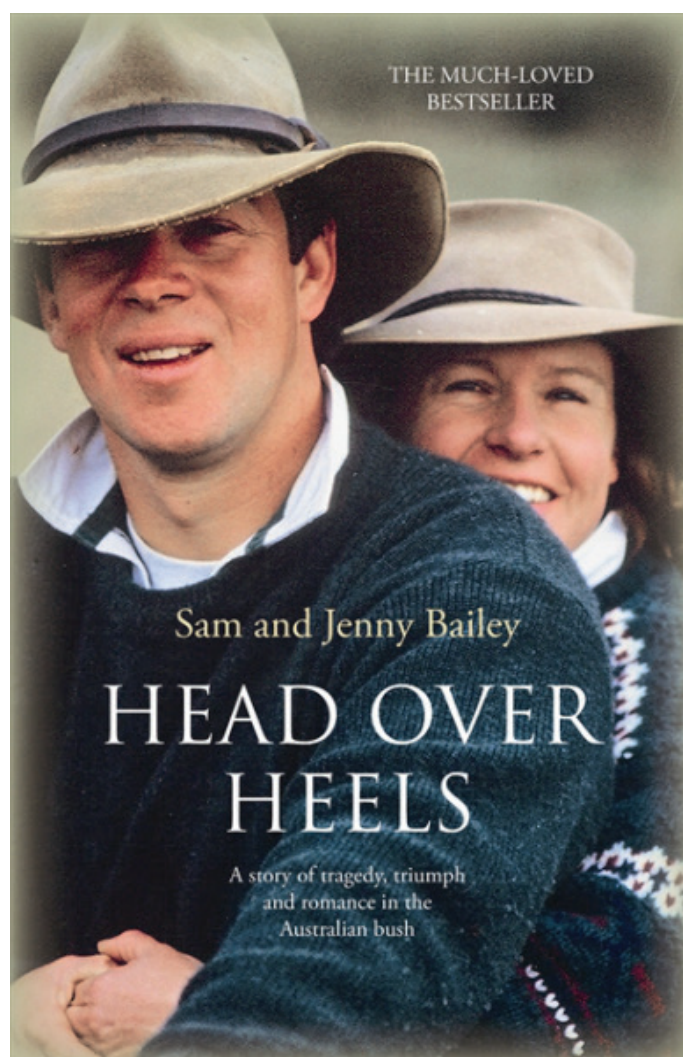
They are also working towards their next big goal – Sam becoming the first quadriplegic in the world

to fly a helicopter and flying into schools to inspire children to fulfil their own dreams and goals.

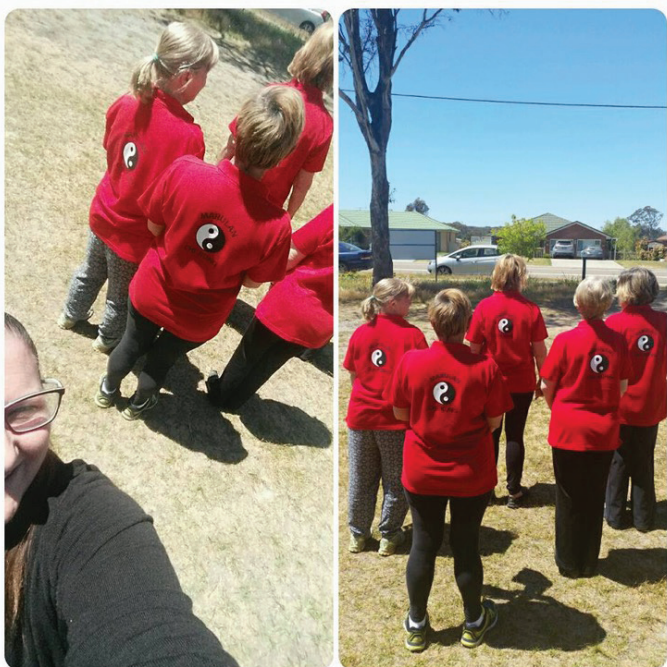
Marulan Chi Kung

Historic Homes of our Area

Marulan is very fortunate in having some really beautiful historic homes in the area. Some of these include Lockyersleigh, Glenrock and Longreach.

Glenrock is one of the loveliest examples of classical Georgian Architecture remaining in Australia. Glenrock was built by George Barber who marvelled at the beauty of the area but sadly he met his death when drowned in the river, returning on horseback from Goulburn.

Following his death, the property was bought by George Morrice and after his death the property was bought by the Government for subdivision of soldier settlements.

Longreach was settled by Peter Stockey and the house is described as a “handsome freestone erection with a commanding and charming view of the Wollondilly River, forming a prospect of great beauty.... altogether there is probably no more beautiful picture of Australian scenery in the district”.

Lockyersleigh was so named in honour of Major Edmund Lockyer’s twenty-five-year military service, the establishment of Albury, discovery of coal in Ipswich and his involvement in the building of the Great South Road to Bungonia. At one time it was the preferred site for Australia’s Capital Territory. The silver which was used in the spade that turned the first sod in the Sydney-Melbourne line was mined there.

Goulburn Mulwaree Mobile Visitor Information Centre

Goulburn’s newest four-wheeled icon is a brightly coloured bus that is council’s new Mobile Visitor Information Centre. Although targeted at visitors and tourists, the van will also cater for our local community.

Expect to see “Vickie” parked at upcoming community events such as the Australia Day celebrations where the community will be able to use the van for anything from providing feedback on key projects to finding out how to pay rates online.

And a reminder that the mobile “Big READ Bus” will next be at Marulan on Thursday 19 January.

Bush Fire and Your Home

PREPARE YOUR HOME AND PROPERTY FOR BUSH FIRES

These maintenance tips may help prevent burning embers destroying your house:

- ☐ Install metal gutter guards
- ☐ Repair damaged or missing tiles on the roof
- ☐ Install fine metal mesh screens on windows and doors
- ☐ Fit seals around doors and windows to eliminate gaps
- ☐ Enclose the areas under the house
- ☐ Repair or cover gaps in external walls
- ☐ Attach a fire sprinkler system to gutters

Things to do around your house and garden:

- ☐ keep lawns short and gardens well maintained
- ☐ cut back trees and shrubs overhanging buildings
- ☐ clean up fallen leaves, twigs and debris around the property
- ☐ have hoses long enough to reach around your house
- ☐ if you have a pool, tank or dam, put a Static Water Supply (SWS) sign on your property entrance
- ☐ check that your insurance is adequate and up to date
- ☐ complete your Bush Fire Survival Plan available at www.rfs.nsw.gov.au.

Not all homes can be defended - your safety is always the first priority.



In a bush fire many houses are destroyed through ember attack, when burning twigs and leaves carried by the wind land on or around the house. Even houses away from the direct path of the fire can be affected.

Look for the places embers could start fires - on the roof, under the floor and around windows and doors – and take action to prevent them.

MARULAN VOLUNTEERS

Who are we? We are a group of local residents trying to improve the appearance of our town.

Why do we do this? If our town looks appealing and cared for, this will attract visitors who will support our local businesses. It also makes it a better environment for us to live in as locals.

What do we do? Local council mows the town's parks and some of its nature strips, but doesn't have the resources to do much more than this. The volunteers supplement the work of council by regularly cutting the edges and whipper snipping the main street and parks. We also weed the gardens in the parks, and collect litter in areas around town. Other less frequent and one-off activities have included: refurbishing the grounds at the Brewer Centre; mulching the gardens in Meridian Park; repairing and painting roadside fences in the main street; and repairing and painting the fence & rotunda in Tony Onions Park.

How often do we do it? Generally speaking, the volunteers work for 2-3 hours on the first and third Monday (starting approximately 9.30am) of each month.

Tallong Twitterings



Christmas time then and now....

It's not often remembered these days that Tallong used to have two churches:

One, St Stephen's Anglican Church, still stands in the bush, off the Highland Way at the entrance to the village. St Stephen's was opened on Saturday 31st December 1892 and the Goulburn papers at the time described it as 'a very neat weatherboard structure built on brick piles and lined with pine'. The opening service taken by Rev. A.C. Moseley from All Saints Church at Marulan was described as 'well attended' although the weather was bad. A 'sumptuous' tea was held afterwards for about 100 people followed by a public meeting to appoint trustees and a church committee. The first Holy Communion service was conducted the following day.

The completion of the Church project was largely due to a number of prominent Sydney churchmen who had country properties in the Barbers Creek (Tallong) area. One was Mr E.W. Molesworth MLA, who donated the land on which the church was built. He was the member for Newtown and later Erskineville between 1889-1901 as well as being closely involved with St Stephen's Church, Newtown and a member of the Anglican Synod. Another was Mr J. Kent, who owned one of the earliest commercial orchards. He was a Sydney accountant and financial advisor, and he was also involved in the Sydney YMCA, the Church Missionary Association and was a member of the Anglican Synod.

The second church in Tallong, no longer standing and largely forgotten, was the Methodist Church in Tamar St. In 1916, £20 was collected to buy two blocks of land and a little later a loan of £200 was arranged to build a church. The Church and Sunday School were opened with a tea meeting and concert on Saturday 22nd December 1917, to which the whole district contributed, followed by the first service the next day when it was reported that 'the Church though seemingly large for so small a village was filled to overflowing'.

The building was reputed to have wonderful acoustics due to the metal lined ceiling and walls. The Morris, McAulay and Rumsey families were Church stalwarts

but over the years the congregations dwindled as people died and families moved away.

By 1965, when the building was totally destroyed during the Chatsbury bushfire, the congregation had fallen to one family with services being held only once a month so it was decided not to rebuild and today there is no trace of it left.

January represents for many Tallong residents a quiet holiday period after the village Christmas celebrations. St Stephen's Church, one of two remaining public buildings this year hosted the annual Christmas Carol Service with a light show and supper. This event is much enjoyed and well attended.

This year's Village Christmas Party was held in the Memorial Hall, our other heritage building, hosted by the RFSB and TCFG, attended by Tallong families who enjoyed the Christmas fare and were entertained by Tony Rodwell's Mountain Dew Band. The highlight was the arrival of Mr and Mrs Santa Clause on the Tallong Brigade's Fire Truck to the accompaniment of the bush band. Many families took the opportunity to create their own family Christmas Santa photos and the finale was everyone joining in the Hokey Pokey

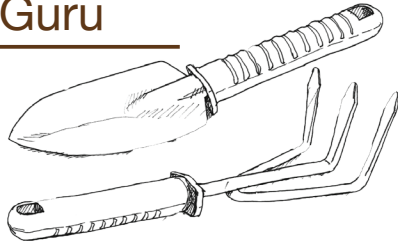

The Garden Guru



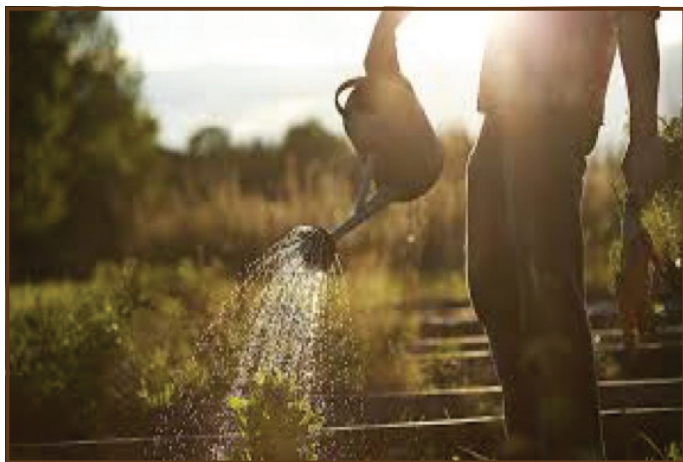
January is usually too hot to do anything too strenuous in the garden but routine watering, harvesting and pest control.

Try to do gardening early morning or early evening. Remember when watering, don't water fast and high but slow and low. It is the root zone that needs the moisture. Use soil wetter to help retain the moisture. Compost and mulch and dense planting also helps.

Keep up pruning of spent flowers heads to maintain compact growth and good flowering, especially with roses.

Watch out for pests and diseases in your gardens. Apply sprays late in the afternoon when the heat has gone from the sun and bees have stopped foraging.

Happy gardening, remember to wear a hat, drink plenty of water and not in the heat of the day.

Savoury Muffins

Muffins in general are incredibly versatile; you can have them for breakfast, lunch or dinner or even as a snack. Great for including in kids' lunch boxes. But have you ever tried savoury muffins? Here's a recipe to get you started. These ones are vegetarian with olives, semi sundried tomatoes, spinach and feta and more but you can add chopped bacon and other things if you prefer. It makes about 12 muffins.

Ingredients

- 2 ½ cups self-raising flour
- ½ bunch spinach
- 150g feta cheese
- ½ cup semi-sundried tomatoes
- ¼ cup sliced olives (no seeds)
- 2 tbspn parmesan
- 1 ⅓ cup milk
- 50g melted butter
- 1 eggs

Method

1. Preheat oven to 200 degrees C and brush a 12 muffin pan with butter or oil.
2. Sift the flour into a large bowl. Add shredded spinach, crumbled feta, chopped sundried tomatoes, olives, parmesan and stir to combine.
3. Whisk together the melted butter, milk and egg until combined and add to the dry ingredients. Mix together.
4. Spoon the mixture into prepared pans. Bake for 20 minutes. Turn onto a wire rack to cool
5. Serve warm with some butter. Yum!

Southern Tablelands Rail Users Group - STRUG

In early October STRUG submitted an application to John Barilaro, Minister for Regional Development, requesting funding for a feasibility study into electrification of the rail line between Sydney and Canberra. When STRUG met with John last February, he told us it would help our case if we had letters of support from the local state Members of Parliament along the rail corridor as well as the Federal Member for Hume and the local councils.

It took us a while to get all these letters of support as well as a local business and a local community group. We submitted the supporting documents with our letter requesting funding to the Department of Regional Development as requested.

You can imagine our surprise when we received a response in December from the Department of Industry, also one of John's responsibilities, saying they would not fund our feasibility study. We have sent an urgent request to John's office seeking a meeting at his earliest convenience so that we can find out what went wrong. We will also be urging John, as leader of the Nationals, to exert influence on the design team working on the new diesel replacement trains. These new trains need to be tilt trains in order to reduce travel times throughout the state.

The Travelling Gourmet



Well Singapore it's time to leave. Not having driven in this part of the world before we coopt the hotels limo driver to guide us from the car rental through the city to the causeway that leads to Malaysia.

One thing you realise very early is that Asian drivers love their horns. They continually honk at everything. I very early realise swearing at everyone doesn't stop the cacophony of horns.

Customs and passport checks only take an hour and we proceed across the causeway and into Malaysia.

Malacca is now known by its new name of Malaka, more authentic Malayan. We head to our base for the next day and a half, Shars Beach Resort which sits in the northern part of Malaka Province, authentic huts, monkeys in trees above and the beach out the front.

The beach which is on the Malaka Straits is flat and uninteresting. On the horizon are hundreds of ships moving through the straits, carrying cargo to the world.

The city centre is a mix of Dutch, Portuguese, English and Malay. This was the port that sent goods from the spice islands to China, Spain, Portugal, England and Europe. It was conquered a number of times in order to control the exotic spices hence the architecture. 15th century Portuguese, 16th century Dutch, 18th century English influence.

After exploring the city, we grab a type of rickshaw, a little old man on a bike and a two seater behind him, we hope he can make it. We explain that we would like a tour of the markets. On the way a taxi runs over the foot of our little old man, he proceeds to chase the taxi leaving us stranded in the middle of the traffic.

Seeing the markets ahead we alight and walk hoping our little man recovers his rickshaw. At every turn down alleys and streets the markets are alive.

On one street vegetables, some unknown to us, the next street spices of all varieties. Being a coastal town a street full of fish, crustaceans and molluscs of every kind. Then the wet street where animals are slaughtered and displayed. We walked quickly down this street.

Everywhere street stalls selling food of varying things satays, noodle dishes, deep fried buns and stir fries of all types, the choice is wide and confusing. We had been advised not to eat street food but the best tip is to pick the busiest one as the turnover will be a safeguard against stomach trouble.

That evening we decided to eat at the resort's restaurant overlooking the water and the staff all speak English. We have them choose our meal the only thing we asked for is that it be typically Malaysian. Presented to us are two dishes of Hokkien noodles with seafood. What a delight, we are hooked on a wonderful dish. We watch the moon rise and breathe in the atmosphere. Tomorrow we visit a Batik factory and head to KL or Kuala Lumpur to those less travelled.

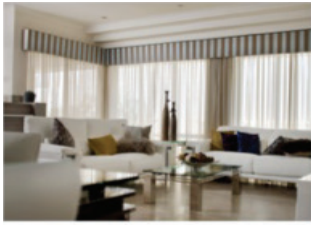

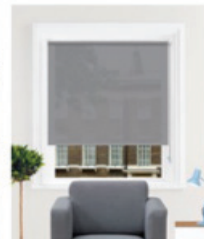
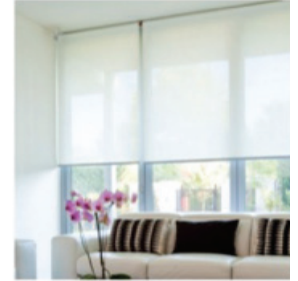
