### Budget on exhibition

Our draft 2017/18 Budget & Operational Plan, the Four Year Delivery Program and the Long Term Financial Plan is on exhibition.

The Delivery Program includes details of activities that we as a council propose to undertake during the period 2017-2021, whilst the Operation Plan provides details of the activities and projects to be undertaken in 2017/18.

Please take the time to review the documents and provide feedback as part of the consultation period; we will be accepting written submissions on any or all aspects of these documents up until the close of business on Friday 12th May 2017.

### Sydney Royal Easter Show

At the end of April, I had the chance to spend some time at the Sydney Royal Easter Show in the Goulburn Australia stand promoting our great region.

The Marketing crew puts in a huge effort each year to promote Goulburn Mulwaree at the show, and should be congratulated for this work. The effort focuses on promotion of our fantastic strategic location, housing affordability, the beautiful outdoor spaces on our doorstep and the rural lifestyle our shire can offer.

### Goulburn University Centre proposal underway

Work is underway behind the scenes on the proposal for a Goulburn University Centre, which would allow students from the Goulburn Mulwaree region and surrounds to undertake higher education studies closer to home.

In late April, the NSW Government announced \$8 million in funding for the expansion of the Country University Centre model. This model is based upon the already successful Cooma University Centre (CUC), which was established in 2013, and has provided facilities and services for more than 175 students undertaking tertiary study.

I'm involved as a member of this committee, and we have a clear goal of a 2018 opening date for the centre, with students utilising the facility from Semester One. The centre will provide high-speed internet, video conferencing, tutorial rooms and computer and printing equipment as well as a university feel that will encourage learning.

### Future of Hockey in this region

We recently held a meeting between Goulburn Hockey, Crookwell Hockey, NSW Hockey, Upper Lachlan Shire Council and Goulburn Mulwaree Council. We agreed to work together proactively and positively to locate a preferred site on council owned land, for a regional hockey facility that will have water based fields.

There is much planning and consultation work to be undertaken, including applications for grant funding, but the first step has now been taken to develop the future of hockey in Goulburn Mulwaree and surrounds.

In the short-term, Goulburn Hockey will now meet with the Goulburn Workers Club to secure the use of the current Workers Club Hockey facilities for the next five years.

A working party has now been established to drive this project through to a successful outcome. This group will consist of one councillor and one staff member from Goulburn Mulwaree Council, three members from Goulburn Hockey Association, one member from Crookwell Hockey and one member from Upper Lachlan Shire Council.



Council has released its budget and forward plans for the next four years. At our recent Chamber meeting it was decided to send a submission to Council to address our expressions that we feel Marulan is being neglected inside a budget that has expenditure in just four items. For example, Performing Arts Centre, Adventure Playground, Swimming Centre revamp and the Wollondilly Walkway of some \$20 million dollars in Goulburn.

The Chamber will be highlighting poor water quality in Marulan, inadequate lighting in George Street and the lack of proper maintenance of streetscape, parklands and playing fields because of time and manpower constraints.

The opening of the Art Exhibition in the Hall was well attended. The current exhibition will run for one month then will be replaced by another group of artist's works. The Chamber has decided to help the organisers financially and hope the exhibition will be a draw card to Marulan.

The Chamber is in process of arranging a business meet and greet with the local Quarries purchasing team from Head Office to see if benefits can be expanded from the quarries side as well as local businesses. The Chamber will shortly advise local businesses when this meeting will take place.

The Chambers next meeting will be held on Thursday 18th May commencing at 6.00 pm at the Marulan Memorial Hall

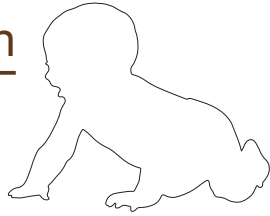

**Who are we?** We are a group of local residents trying to improve the appearance of our town.

**Why do we do this?** If our town looks appealing and cared for, this will attract visitors who will support our local businesses. It also makes it a better environment for us to live in as locals.

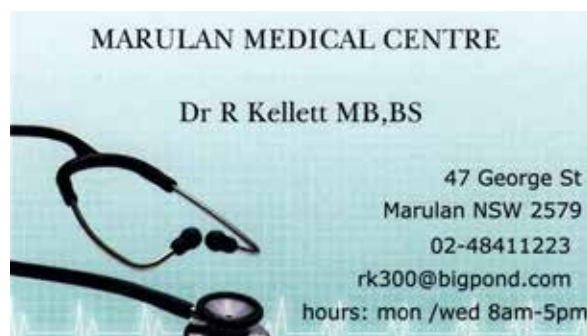
**What do we do?** Local council mows the town's parks and some of its nature strips, but doesn't have the resources to do much more than this. The volunteers supplement the work of council by regularly cutting the edges and whipper snipping the main street and parks. We also weed the gardens in the parks, and collect litter in areas around town. Other less frequent and one-off activities have included: refurbishing the grounds at the Brewer Centre; mulching the gardens in Meridian Park; repairing and painting roadside fences in the main street; and repairing and painting the fence & rotunda in Tony Onions Park.

**How often do we do it?** Generally speaking, the volunteers work for 2-3 hours on the first and third Monday (starting approximately 9.30am) of each month.

## Local Business Spotlight



We introduce our community to the Marulan Medical Centre, located in the Brewer Centre at 47 George Street, Marulan. Opening hours are Monday and Wednesday 8.00 am to 5.00 pm. Here you will find Dr Robert Kellett who's special interests include minor surgery, chronic and complex medical conditions, mental health and emergency medicine.

The Marulan Medical Centre has been in business in the Marulan area for the past 15 years. What makes the Centre unique is that they do not rush people through. Doctor Kellett's main aim is to provide a quality service. Dr Kellett likes living in Marulan and conducting business in the local area as the community is very friendly as well as appreciates having a GP in the local area.

When Dr Kellett had purchased a bush block in Big Hill and was building a house, he was offered work in Goulburn in a general practice but decided to set up his own practice in Marulan. He wasn't sure if it would be viable because of the small population, but the community has been very supportive.

The Medical Centre has seen changes in technology over the years such as initially using electronic medical records and sending off Medicare claims manually, then via an EFTPOS machine. They now send the claims online. Over the past few years the Centre has noticed the population growth and are taking on new patients and would like to expand the service.



Now that Goulburn Community Health is no longer using the building, the Centre is currently looking for allied health staff to work from the building. The Medical Centre would love to hear from people in allied health (physiotherapists, podiatrists, psychologist, exercise physiologists, osteopaths, etc.) who are interested in using either of the two spare rooms in the building.

A year after opening his office, which was just down the road from where he now works, Dr Kellett was fortunate enough to obtain funding from the NSW Department of Health for construction of a Medical Centre and community facility. Other sources of funding were obtained by Goulburn Community Health, Goulburn Mulwaree Council provided the land, and now we have a building which is a great asset to the community for many decades.

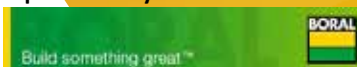

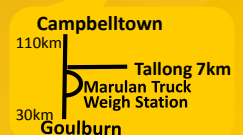

### **Marulan Cemetery court case**

The hearing of the proceedings in Goulburn Mulwaree Council at Al-Mabarat Benevolent Society commenced on Tuesday 28 March 2017. Initially, the Court undertook a site inspection with the parties. This was followed by the Court hearing evidence from 16 objectors in the Local Court in Montague Street. And then the presentation of expert's evidence was presented to the Court.

The Court heard evidence in relation to the permissibility of the development and its proposed management as well as evidence from the parties' traffic consultants and ecologists.

That part of the hearing which involves hearing evidence from residents, the parties and their experts is now complete. The only outstanding matter is for the Court to hear closing submissions from the parties' legal representatives. The Court has adjourned the proceedings to 23 June 2017 to enable this to occur.

Council will inform residents of the outcome of the proceedings when judgment is delivered.

### **Goulburn University Centre proposal to allow students to study locally**

Work is underway behind the scenes on the proposal for a Goulburn University Centre, which would allow students from the Goulburn Mulwaree region and surrounds to undertake higher education studies closer to home.

Over the weekend the NSW Government announced \$8 million in funding for the expansion of the Country University Centre model. This model is based upon the already successful Cooma University Centre (CUC), which was established in 2013, and has provided facilities and services for more than 175 students undertaking tertiary study.

As of 2011, 9.2% of Goulburn Mulwaree residents aged over 18 had a Bachelor Degree or higher, in comparison with the Regional NSW average of 12.4%.

Chair of the Goulburn University Centre Steering Committee, Guy Milson, said the establishment of a centre in Goulburn could help close the gap between Goulburn and the Regional NSW average.

"The establishment of this facility would allow people in Goulburn the opportunity to live at home, close to the support networks of family and friends, while undertaking tertiary studies. Moving away from home to study isn't for everyone, and we want to create a space that will make Higher Education an option for these people."

"We believe the centre will be well utilised by school leavers who wish to study without having to move to the city, but also by mature age students who can now take the chance to further their education within their hometown."

Bob Kirk, Mayor of Goulburn Mulwaree, has been involved in pushing the proposal along from the beginning. "The committee has a clear goal for a 2018 opening date. The centre would provide high-speed internet, video conferencing, tutorial rooms and computer and printing equipment as well as a university feel that will encourage learning."

"We are pleased by the strong show of support from the NSW Government, and are looking forward to presenting our proposal to Country Universities Centres."

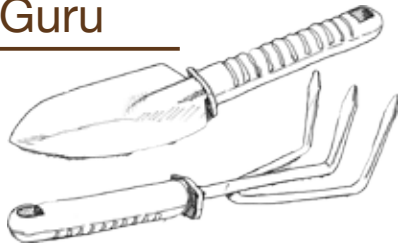

## The Garden Guru



May brings cool, crisp days and lovely coloured foliage on deciduous trees and shrubs. The autumn bulbs are starting to bring a bit of colour. The weather is usually quite nice for working out in the garden. As the leaves fall, rake and collect them to make a rich leaf mould to add to soils and pots or just add them to the compost heap.



It is time to plant trees, shrubs and climbers. Camellia, citrus, roses and deciduous trees are now available at garden centres. It is also a good month for planting lilies or dividing existing ones that have flowered for three or more years. When planting citrus, be aware that they like plenty of sun and should not be exposed to draughts.



A sheltered, north facing position is ideal with good drainage. If your soil is full of clay, make a raised bed. Frosts are also part of cooler weather with clear starry nights. Protect at-risk plants with shade cloth or even some newspaper. Remove the next day. Leave any frost damage until the end of winter before pruning it off to make way for spring growth.

### Tasty Salmon Burgers

Looking for a simple and delicious meal for the family during the week? You can't go past good old salmon burgers. Enjoy them as is or place them inside burger buns with all the trimmings.

#### Ingredients:

- ½ cup breadcrumbs
- 1 tin salmon (drained)
- 1 shallots (minced)
- 3 tablespoons mayonnaise
- 2 tablespoons fresh parsley (minced)
- 2 teaspoons dijon mustard
- 1/8 teaspoons salt
- 1/8 teaspoons pepper
- lemon wedges
- 1 tablespoon oil

#### Directions:

Drain salmon and mash with a fork. Combine with breadcrumbs.

Whisk shallot, mayonnaise, parsley, mustard, salt and pepper together, then gently fold into salmon mixture until combined.

Divide mixture into 4 equal portions.

Form each into loose ball, then pat lightly into burger shape; place on large plate.

Cover and refrigerate burgers for at least 1 hour or up to 24 hours.

Heat oil in frypan over medium-high heat until shimmering.

Pan-fry burgers until crisp and well browned on first side, 4 to 5 minutes. Flip and cook other side for 4 or 5 minutes.

Serve with lemon wedges with some steamed veggies or else create a burger by placing in buns and filling with all the trimmings

## Wildlife in our Environment

We are lucky enough to be located in a region where there are many varied types of amazing wildlife all around us. However, unfortunately the negative aspect of this is that many of our wildlife are victims, every day to road traffic accidents. These accidents often severely injure or claim the lives of these animals.

In recent months we have been witness to a number of animals which have been just left severely injured on the side of the road to suffer



terribly, often for a very long time.

We implore everyone who is driving on our roads to be vigilant. These accidents may be unfortunately unavoidable, however if you do hit any beautiful animal on our roads, **please, please, please** stop to check:

### **1. Is it definitely dead?**

-if so, please take it off the road to avoid further damage to vehicles or humans

-please check to see if it is female or male

-if it is female please check her pouch to ensure she does not have a joey. If she does either bring the entire mum to your local vet, or call your local wildlife-savvy veterinarian (us!) or WIRES for instructions on how to remove the joey safely.

**2. If it is alive and severely injured and you are able to SAFELY take it to your local veterinarian**, please do so as quickly as possible.

**3. If it is alive and severely injured and you are not able to safely take it to your local veterinarian:** call WIRES on (02) 4822 3888 (Tablelands) or 1300 WIRES (Highlands). You may also contact Wildlife Rescue South Coast on: 0418 417 214

## Lumps and Bumps:

Many of our pets develop lumps in or on various parts of their body, particularly as they get older. Sometimes you may notice lumps on the skin of your pet – they can appear in various locations, and can vary greatly in their sizes and appearances. If you do notice an unusual lump or bump on your pet, we thoroughly recommend that you have it examined by a veterinarian.

Your vet may need to take a sample to either make a diagnosis in house or to send away to an external laboratory to obtain a diagnosis. Your pet's lump may be either benign or malignant and may require removal or be fine to just monitor at the stage of growth that it is. It is ALWAYS better to get them checked earlier rather than later. If they require removal, it is much easier on your pet if this is done earlier rather than later.
