2019/20 Operational Plan

A reminder that community members have until Friday 17th May to provide comments and submissions on the 2019/20 Operational Plan.

Councillors have worked through this document with staff over the past two months during workshops, and we are pleased that we are able to deliver a balanced budget which will continue with a number of major projects including the ones set out below in the Capital Works update.

It is important to note that IPART has set the rate pegging limit for 2019/20 at 2.7%; this amount continues to be short of the real cost increases we as a Council are facing.

We will be increasing the domestic waste charge for the year by around \$25 and the rural waste fee by \$15 as we continue to deal with increased costs for recycling and waste disposal. Fees and charges at the gates of our Waste Management Centres will also see some rises to ensure that the Waste Business unit is self-funding. Although Council never likes to raise charges, it is necessary within this area to ensure we remain sustainable – waste disposal is a costly business.

I am pleased to inform residents that sewer and water charges will rise by only 0.25% for 2019/20, and council does not intend to charge a stormwater levy for the next financial year.

Projects for Marulan in 2019/20 budget include:

- Environmental improvement works at the Waste Management Centre,
- George Street landscaping to beautify this space
- Membrane replacement at the Marulan Water Treatment Plant to improve water quality
- \$500,000 for the feasibility study and concept design for the Marulan Wastewater Treatment Plant

Those who make a submission will be invited to discuss their issues when all submissions are considered at the Council Meeting on Tuesday 4 June 2019 at 6pm. The public is welcome to attend this meeting.

The festival attracts huge crowds each year and seems to go from strength to strength. What a great initiative of the community it is, and I look forward to another successful event for 2019.

150th anniversary celebrations of the arrival of the first train to Goulburn

On the weekend of the 25th May we will be celebrating the 150th anniversary of the first train arriving in Goulburn. The development of the railway to Goulburn was the result of lobbying from graziers and pastoralists wanting faster and cheaper transport to markets in Sydney. The first meeting was held in 1846, but it was not until 1869 that the railway finally reached the city of Goulburn.

The first locomotive and carriage facilities were built at North Goulburn adjacent to the Goldsmith Street level crossing. As the volume of traffic increased expanded servicing facilities were relocated nearer the station platform.

The event is being organised by the Goulburn Loco Roundhouse Preservation Society. Festivities will begin at the Goulburn Train Station from 10am on Saturday 25th May – for more information visit the Goulburn Australia website.



Hume Highway Acceleration Lane and Intersection

Work has finished on the intersection of Red Hills Rd and the Hume Highway with only the final line marking to go. The new surface is far superior to the old and for those that use the road every day, the improvement is a fantastic result.

Initial roto-milling of the old surface was carried out in January and the deep lift asphalt surface was placed soon after. The work was carried out on a weekend which minimised the disruption to highway and local traffic.

Maintenance and resealing work along the Primary Transport Route is ongoing in 2019, funded by Gunlake section 94 road maintenance contributions



Boral Marulan South Limestone SSD Application : Clarification

Boral has become aware there is concern about the potential effects upon local water supplies if our State Significant Development (SSD) planning application for Marulan South Limestone is approved.

To clarify, at present the Limestone operations are supplied with water via a pipeline connected to the Tallong Dam reservoir. This has been the case for almost 40 years.

The SSD seeks to allow us to build our own water storage so we can reduce our reliance on the Tallong reservoir, and eventually stop using it altogether. We certainly are NOT looking to connect the new yet-to-be-approved storage to the Tallong Dam.

Glossy Black Cockatoos

Boral Marulan south Operations had the pleasure partner with OEH, Wingecarribee Council and local Penrose residents to assist in the development of a vegetation corridor for the Glossy Black Cockatoos.

The Glossy Black Cockatoos have been identified as an endangered species primarily as a result of the loss of habitat. Council and OEH have a program to encourage landholders to provide land for vegetation corridors for future habitat for the birds. Boral was able to participate and provide support in one such local planting.

Soldier On and support for Defence Forces transition

Boral support the promotion and transition of Defence Force personnel into our business.

In support of this, we work closely with Soldier On Australia, who provide support services for national service personnel and their families. One of their roles is helping national services personnel secure their futures in other work roles beyond defence.



Tallong's Apple Heritage

Commercial orcharding in the Tallong district began in the 1890s after the passing of the Robertson Land Act in 1861, which encouraged the purchase of small blocks of land, and the opening of the railway to Sydney in 1868, which enabled easy access to markets. Between WW1 and WW2, it has been estimated that there were up to 35 productive orchards in the Tallong area.



The story of Tallong's historic apple orchards can be hard to unravel at times; owners and property names changed and there was no street numbering system until the mid-20th century. However, the land title history of the last commercial orchard in Tallong is clear. Originally selected by George Gardiner in July 1901, Lot 8, a block of 80 acres, fronts what is now Kettles Lane and the property passed at his death to his sons, Edward, Walter and John. John and Walter transferred their interest in the property to Edward in 1916. In 1920 Edward sold to Francis Brown who, in the same year, subdivided Lot 8 into two 40 acre blocks, retaining the front "A" block for himself. The "B" block was sold to a marine engineer and his wife, James and Olive Duncan in 1926. At this time the "B" block orchard was known as "Sans Souci" ("Without Care") and it retained this name until at least 1952. When James and Olive retired to Sydney in 1935, "Sans Souci" was taken over by their eldest daughter Carrie and her husband Alan Jones. Unfortunately, their marriage did not survive WW2 and the orchard was sold to Arthur Johnston (the lessee of Davenport's Store) in 1947 to be managed by his son Harold (Hec) who had married James and Olive's youngest daughter Ethel Joan in 1943. At the end of 1951, both "A" and "B" blocks were sold to James Herbert Watling who passed the reunited property to his son James Manuel (Jim) Watling in 1982. The orchard name changed to "Homeley" and was run by Jim until his death. Then the property was sold to its current owners Magnus and Belle Agrun who changed the name once again to "The Orchard" and run a farm stay business as well as the orchard.



Tallong's apple heritage is celebrated each year at the Tallong Apple Festival held on the first Sunday in May which this year was held on Sunday 5th May. Many people came along to enjoy the live music and the many market and food stalls. There was wood chopping, whip cracking and sheep shearing demonstrations and crowds thrilled to medieval battles and snake and reptile displays. The Hyatt, Canberra once again gave cooking demonstrations and displays of vintage cars and internal combustion engines interested many. The ever popular Fleece to Garment display proved a major drawcard as well as Mrs T's Bake Off and the Apple Pie Eating competitions. There will a more detailed report next month.

French Onion Soup

Following the wild success of The Marulan Café's first "Dine Around the World" night, and the awesome compliments we received, we thought we'd share the recipe for the one of the courses we offered: French Onion Soup. This recipe will serve 10. You can freeze any leftovers. Bon Appetit!

Ingredients:


- 250 g unsalted butter
- 3 kg brown / yellow onions, thinly sliced
- 400ml dry white wine
- 5 tbsp plain flour
- 3 3/4 litres beef or chicken stock
- 5 dried bay leaves
- 5 sprigs fresh thyme
- Salt and pepper
- 10 slices French baguette or similar
- 1 cup shredded tasty cheese to melt on bread
- Parsley for garnish

Directions:

1. Caramelize the onions: Melt the butter in a heavy based casserole pot over medium heat. When it starts to foam, add onions and stir so they're coated in butter. Turn down the heat to medium low. Cook for 30 minutes stirring every few minutes, until the onions have softened and are semi-transparent. Then turn up the heat to medium high. Add salt, and cook for a further 20 minutes, stirring regularly, until the onions are deep golden and sweet.
2. Make the soup: Deglaze the pan: Add the wine and simmer rapidly for 2 minutes until mostly evaporated. Stir to scrape the bottom of the pot. Sprinkle the flour over the onion and cook for a further minute. Add the broth, thyme and bay leaves. Cover and reduce the heat so it simmers gently. Simmer it for 30 minutes.
3. Make the cheesy toast: Preheat the grill to high. Toast each side of the bread until light golden. Top each piece of bread with cheese. Grill until melted and some brown spots appear.
4. Serve: Season the soup with salt and pepper to taste. Ladle into bowls. Top with cheesy toast and a sprig of parsley.

Growing a Lemon Tree

Lemons can be grown in tubs or pots on a balcony, patio or in a garden.

Potted lemons can produce a reliable crop. You need to find the sunniest spot to plant the tree, whether in a pot or in the ground. Before planting, soak the root ball in a bucket of water. Dig a hole twice the size of the root ball. Position the level with the surrounding soil then back fill.

Avoid planting near concrete or using concrete rings around lemon trees as leaching of lime causes the leaves to discolour.



The Meyer lemon is more tolerant to the growing conditions in our area than other varieties. They are big feeders so fertilise or manure every three to six months or add slow release fertiliser to potted lemons. Soil should be kept moist but not too wet as this will yellow the leaves. Extra watering will be required over the warmer months.

Peeing on a lemon tree really does work to help it grow. Urine is made up of salts, urea and water which is much like a fertiliser. If you are a bit shy, pee in a container then sprinkle it around the tree.

Place mulch around the tree to keep the weeds down and help retain moisture. Do not place it too close to the trunk as this can encourage rot.

Prune to encourage new growth by cutting back half the current, years, growth before planting. Then prune annually when mature, to keep in shape and fruit within picking distance.

Lemon trees will require a shelter over winter to protect them from frost damage for the first few years.

Lemons have many uses in cooking, are a source of Vitamin C and a slice is great in a glass of gin and tonic.


