The Terminus Hotel

It would seem that 'The Terminus' was established as a hotel in the early 1860s prior to the opening of the railway in 1868, making it one of the longest continuously trading hotels in rural NSW.

In 1867 an advertisement in the Sydney Morning Herald offering land for sale at Mooroooolen (original name of Marulan) shows the Terminus in operation.

At the turn of the century when all licences were recalled by the Government, only one permit was issued in Marulan - to the Terminus. It was rumoured that the reason the Terminus was selected for the licence was because the licensee was a member of that parliament.



FEBRUARY 2020

TO DO THIS MONTH ...

MAKE SURE that the birds & wildlife have enough fresh water.

PLANT winter vegetable seedlings..

PRUNE rambling roses after flowering

DEADHEAD flowers as they fade & trim lavender back.

COLLECT ripening seed from plants if you wish to propagate.

WATER vegetables & fruit regularly (don't forget we are still on water restrictions)

FEED & WATER all plants in containers.

START planting spring bulbs.

PLANTS FOR FREE! Ask your neighbours for cuttings.

DON'T water the lawn - it will soon recover when the rains come - well we hope so anyway, both the recovery & the rain!)

TIE up tomato plants & pick the fruit as it ripens.

HAPPY GARDENING!

Wildlife has inevitably suffered, both in numbers & range of species, as the environment has become progressively degraded.






HEALTHY FUTURE

Amber Level Water Restrictions are now in effect



All areas of Goulburn and Marulan with reticulated water are now on amber level water restrictions. Target consumption is 230 litres per person per day.

Under amber level restrictions, use of Goulburn and Marulan water supply is restricted to:

- Hand held hose with a control nozzle or bucket can only be used between 5pm and 10am to water plants and lawns
- Watering systems and hose sprinklers can only be used between 5pm and 10am on weekends
- Paths, driveways and hard surfaces cannot be cleaned. In extraordinary circumstances for example following a health threatening incident, a hose can be used to assist to clean up
- Vehicles can be washed at any time on a lawn or porous surface using a hose with a control nozzle, bucket or low volume high pressure machine
- Private pools can only be filled when a water offset plan for that residence has been met, including the mandatory use of a pool cover when the pool is not in use. For further details see [Council's Water Use Policy](#)

INGREDIENTS:

1/2c finely chopped apricots
2T cider vinegar
2T brown sugar
12 thick pork sausages

METHOD:

Combine apricot, vinegar, sugar & 1T water in a small saucepan. Cook, uncovered, stirring occasionally, about 10 mins. or until mixture has thickened. Meanwhile cook the sausages on the grill or barbecue until cooked through. Serve sausages w. apricot chutney, Crisp Eggplant Salad & Sweet potato chips.

Serves 4

INGREDIENTS:

1 thinly sliced Eggplant
Olive Oil
1 Cos Lettuce, washed w.
leaves separated
150g marinated Fetta
2T torn basil leaves
Cracked black pepper

METHOD:

Brush eggplant w. olive oil and grill on hot plate or barbecue until crisp. Place Cos lettuce on salad dish or individual plates, top with crumbled fetta, basil leaves, cracked pepper and some extra olive oil if you like.

SWEET POTATO CRISPS WITH CHILLI SALT

Serves 4

INGREDIENTS:

1.5kg mixed Sweet Potato
2t sea salt flakes
1/2t dried chilli flakes
1/2t sweet paprika



METHOD:

Using a vegetable peeler, peel the potatoes then using the same peeler, slice the potatoes into long, thin strips. Deep-fry the potato strips in a wok of hot oil or an air fryer in batches, until browned slightly and nice & crisp.

Drain on a wire rack placed over some paper towel. Combine salt, chilli & paprika in a small bowl. Sprinkle Hot crisps with the the chilli salt mixture.

BANANA CARAMEL TART

Serves 4

INGREDIENTS:

1 sheet puff pastry
1T butter
2T brown sugar
2 medium bananas,
sliced thinly.



METHOD:

Preheat oven to 220 deg. C.

Place pastry on an oven tray which has been sprayed with cooking oil. Fold edges of pastry in to make a border all the way around, about 1cm turn in. Place another tray on top of the pastry sheet and bake for 10 mins (this stops the pastry from rising). Combine butter & sugar in small pan. Heat until smooth. Combine bananas & mixture in a bowl. Mix well and top tart base. Bake about 10 mins.



*****IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING THE 2020 TALLONG APPLE DAY FESTIVAL*****

On behalf of The Tallong Community Focus Group and Tallong Apple Day Committee that we wish to advise The 2020 Tallong Apple Day Festival has been cancelled.

Please note this decision has not been made lightly and has been in consultation with many involved in the organisation of our community event. The reasons for this decision were extensive and included:

. Community and visitors safety and concerns

. The committee rely on sponsorship, donations and volunteers to hold the event and we feel that with the recent enormous generosity from our local community members and businesses it will be inappropriate at this time to ask for support for the festival

. Whilst to date the current fire season has had minimal property loss to our village, there has been enormous loss to our neighboring villages, enormous affects to our Flora and Fauna all which will take time to recover

.
