Did you know that Marulan is located on the 150th Meridian and is the perfect place to celebrate the coming of spring and the warmer weather?

Each year we celebrate with the Annual Kite festival, encouraging families to fly a kite and enjoy the carnival atmosphere of the festival.



The Kite festival is a community event run by not-for-profit local community representatives with any profits being returned to the community groups involved. We aim to bring tourists to the town of Marulan to not only experience the festival but the surrounds of Marulan, Tallong and Bungonia as well.

This year the festival celebrates the Spring Solstice where "Time Flies" so come along and experience the fun as we turn back time.

The 2018 festival will be held on SUNDAY 23rd September 2018, between 9am and 3 pm in TONY ONIONS PARK in GEORGE STREET MARULAN.

Our celebration of Spring kicks off on the 8th September 2018 with an official opening of The ART SHOW AND EXHIBITION OF WORKS and the formal launch of the Kite festival.

This year's Art and photography Show are themed on the celebration of spring and Time Flies, with generous prize money being available for the People's Choice Award, best Art Piece, best Sculpture, best Youth piece and best Photograph.

The Exhibition will be open on the weekend of the 8th and 9th September, 15th and 16th Sunday and 22nd and 23rd September.

Sunday 23rd September 2018 brings the main day of the festival with stalls, games, events and a car and bike show.

At 9.30am we celebrate the awakening of spring with the building of a Mandala with the community's help.

This will be followed at 10am with the Marulan Public School Choir, bringing Spring in with song.

At 10.30 come and make some noise and support the Marulan Public school with their Rain Dance!

At 11.30 am the fun continues with the running of the Pet show. This is a fun show with entries in lots of different categories - smallest pet, cutest pet, best behaved pet, most unusual pet, and so on There are 1st, 2nd and 3rd winners in each category with everyone receiving a prize.

Alice will also be exploring the Kite festival wonderland in search of the White Rabbit. Come and help her find where he might be.



The Wizards School will be open and giving lessons on wand making with professor Pandora Lovegood, Professor Tess Scamander and Head master Darius Octavius Rinsewind, for young and old wizards and witches. Come dressed as your favourite wizard.





Red Kites's Kite Man will also once again be making an appearance.

If you don't have a kite you can make one on the day and join in the fun. NPWS will have a focus on the Glossy Black Cockatoos so come and make your own cockatoo kite.



Marulan Village Plan Working Party

The Marulan Village Plan Working Party has now been finalised with Tegan Rubs appointed as the community representative at the Council meeting on the 7th August.

The group also includes David Humphreys (Marulan Chamber of Commerce), Maureen Eddy (Marulan Lions Club), John Nicastri (Marulan and District Progress Association), Alana White (Holcim), Geoff Kettle (Gunlake), Dean Beltrame (Boral), & Cr Peter Walker as Council's representative.

The first meeting was held on Thursday 23rd August and I am told went quite well. If you have enquiries or suggestions on implementation of the Marulan Village Plan I would recommend speaking with one of the above representatives on the working party.

Towrang Village Discretionary Fund Working Party

Asbestos Disposal fee reduced

It will now be cheaper to dispose of asbestos at the Goulburn Waste Management Centre after Councillors resolved to reduce the associated fees at the first meeting in August.

We don't currently accept asbestos at the Marulan Waste Management Centre due to the requirements involved in processing this waste but I am sure many in Marulan utilise the Goulburn centre for this service and will be pleased by the price drop.

The tonnage rate for bonded asbestos disposal has now been reduced to in line with the general waste fee, being \$224/ tonne with a minimum load of \$22 for local residents. This would allow residents to dispose of up to 100kg of asbestos with any amounts beyond this being charged at the weighed rate.

Asbestos disposal must be booked in advance by calling the gatehouse at the Goulburn Waste Management Centre on 4823 4839.

Pet of the Week

A quick note to remind you of our Companion Animal Facility located in Goulburn. Our staff do a lot of great work in rehoming animals that find their way into the pound and we are again encouraging individuals and families considering a new pet to first take a look at the CAF.

Staff provide all the information on the animal and will help you when making your decision; and the feedback we get time and time again is that rehoming an animal is incredibly rewarding and the best decision people make!



We'd like to thank those who took the time to visit our 'drop in' centre at the Marulan Hall on 8 and 9 August in support of our upcoming planning proposals.

The 'centre' was opened specifically to help the community better understand our impending State Significant Development (SSD) application for the Marulan South Limestone site, and a modification we need to make to the Peppertree Quarry planning approval.

Matters discussed with us included the proposed overburden emplacements to be built around the sites, traffic on Marulan South Road, and the continuing improvement of our dust emissions management. We're also grateful for additional feedback we've received about the applications in person, via phone and email.





Tallong Twitterings



The heritage story of discovery, settlement in the area to the southwest of the early Colony of New South Wales is one that has been brought into the present in 2018. First, in March the celebration of 200 years since Governor Lachlan Macquarie sent the first official survey party to explore the area and secondly the August 6th celebration of 150 years since the Marulan section of the Great Southern Railway was complete. Congratulations to the Marulan and District Historical Society with the Bundanoon Historical Society for this recent celebration and to Janet and Dugald Black for their very well documented account of the stages of development and impacts the railway had on local places along the line.

Although Tallong is only one of many places today serviced by the South West rail line, at the recent ceremony CEO of Sydney Trains Howard Collins reminded us that the construction, staffing and maintenance of the railway was in fact building communities in these isolated settlements. When the stretch of railway between Bundanoon and Marulan comprising sections 6 and 7 of the Great Southern Railway was planned and given out to tender as early as 1864 camps were set up for workers and their families which in turn attracted a first school and other community services to this area. Local records show that by the turn of the century rail workers together with a fledgling orchard industry formed a substantial



part of this community. Originally this part of the line was distinguished as a stopping place to provide water for the steam engines and was called Barbers Creek Tank. Water was pumped up from the creek to a tank on the south side of the line. In 1878 a platform was installed on the down side and Barbers Creek Station opened. The Barbers Creek community successfully lobbied for improvements such as goods sheds, sidings, loading facilities and individuals and community groups sent many letters to the Railway Department asking for a change of name. Eventually in 1905 the railway made the change official and became Tallong Station.

Although, today, we see that much that was has been dismantled, Howard Collins says this community strengthening legacy will extend into the near future. According to him Rail Transport is a booming industry offering challenging work for this and the next generation. Railway work assisted development of many of these Great Southern Rail communities. Mr. Collins used a Tallong resident Paul Daly who is the current manager of all stations from Moss Vale to Marulan as an example of three generations of one family employed by NSW Trains.

Another Heritage issue that has come to the fore recently at Tallong Park Estate is the plight of our endangered Glossy Black Cockatoos. At this information session run by field officers of the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage the Glossies in the Mist Project hopes to secure foraging and breeding habitat for the Glossy Black Cockatoo within the Great Western Wildlife Corridor. To this end The National Parks and Wildlife Service are propagating Allocasuarina litoralis plants and distributing them to land owners for mass planting.

MARULAN VOLUNTEERS

Who are we? We are a group of local residents trying to improve the appearance of our town.

Why do we do this? If our town looks appealing and cared for, this will attract visitors who will support our local businesses. It also makes it a better environment for us to live in as locals.

What do we do? Local council mows the town's parks and some of its nature strips, but doesn't have the resources to do much more than this. The volunteers supplement the work of council by regularly cutting the edges and whipper snipping the main street and parks. We also weed the gardens in the parks, and collect litter in areas around town. Other less frequent and one-off activities have included: refurbishing the grounds at the Brewer Centre; mulching the gardens in Meridian Park; repairing and painting roadside fences in the main street; and repairing and painting the fence & rotunda in Tony Onions Park.

How often do we do it? Generally speaking, the volunteers work for 2-3 hours on the first and third Monday (starting approximately 9.30am) of each month.

The Creative Cook



Veggie Burritos

Who doesn't love a warm, crisp, toasted burrito on a chilly day? Here's a really simple recipe for a delicious veggie burrito that takes just minutes to prepare. You can of course add pulled chicken or pork to your burritos if you wish, but Creative Cook prefers to go the veggie road. Enjoy!

Ingredients:

For the seasoned rice:

1 tablespoon oil

1 clove garlic

1 teaspoon chili powder

1/4 teaspoon cumin

1/4 teaspoon oregano

180 grams long grain white rice

1/2 teaspoon salt

350 mls water

For the burrito filling:

850g black beans

225g shredded cheddar

2 spring onions

120 mls salsa

8 large tortillas

Directions:

- Sprinkle the shredded zucchini with salt. Place in a Start by making the seasoned rice: In a pot, sauté the minced garlic in the oil over medium heat for about a minute.
- 2. Stir in the chili powder, cumin, oregano, and rice and stir for a couple of minutes to toast the rice and spices.
- 3. Add the water and salt to the pot. Place a lid on top and turn the heat up to high. Allow it to come to a boil, then turn the heat down to low. Let simmer on low for 15 minutes. After 15 minutes, turn the heat off, and let the rice rest for five minutes. Fluff the rice with a fork.
- 4. While the rice is cooking, rinse and drain the black beans. Slice the spring onions.
- 5. To assemble the burritos: Microwave four tortillas for 30 seconds to make them soft and easy to roll.
- 6. For each tortilla add about 1/3 cup rice, 1/3 cup beans, 1 Tbsp salsa, 1/4 cup shredded cheddar, and a few slices of spring onions. Roll the burritos up tightly, folding in the sides first to hold in the filling.

7. Place the tortillas on a grill or on a slightly oiled frypan on low heat until toasted and the cheese inside has melted.



You can store the burritos in an air-tight container in the refrigerator for 4-5 days, or wrap each burrito individually in parchment paper or plastic wrap, place in a freezer bag, and freeze for up to three months.
